Introduction

he Graf Archive covers the majority of the moon Orchis 2. Its endless shelves, galleries, and databanks contain texts, artworks, antiques, and preserved plants and animals from every sector of the galaxy.

Items that cannot be immediately identified are moved to the underground Shadow Stacks, where they wait to be processed, often for many years. Venturing into these dusty basements is an important part of an Archivist's training, a kind of final exam. The challenge is to come back with an unexpected treasure. It can be dangerous, as one young student discovered when the mummified ghest he was examining turned out to be merely hibernating. . . .

These ancient hand-drawn maps were unearthed from the Shadow Stacks by a far luckier student. The Head Curator's theory is that they are the work of the great Ithorian artist Gammit Chond. We know very little about Chond—few of his works have survived—but these maps show much of his characteristic style and flair.

Chond never traveled off-world, and it is rumored that he never ventured more than a day's walk from his home. However, he was fascinated by the tales of travelers, and many of his works depict their stories of adventure in the rest of the galaxy.

Of course, these maps are not strictly accurate. No one should try to cross the Jundland Wastes using Chond's map of Tatooine. The artist was more interested in the feel of these strange worlds and the galaxy-shaking events that took place on them.

These maps seem to be centered on the saga of the legendary Skywalker family. While many of the things Chond has included are facts, some may merely be tales spun by explorers. Together, it all presents a unique view of a fascinating slice of history.

After several years of painstaking restoration, it is my great privilege, and that of the Graf Archive, to present this neverbefore-seen collection of art to the galaxy.

—Amel Fortoon, Director, Graf Archive THE GALAXY IS GENERALLY THOUGHT TO BE DIVIDED INTO THE FOLLOWING REGIONS. GALACTIC NORTH IS THE DIRECTION TOWARD THE TOP OF THE CHART.

DEEP CORE: Densely packed stars rotate around the super-massive black hole at the heart of the galaxy. It is dangerous to navigate, and few travelers venture this far coreward.

CORE WORLDS: The richest and most important worlds cluster around the edges of the Deep Core. These include Coruscant, Corellia, Kuat, Hosnian Prime, and other key systems.

COLONIES: This region contains planets colonized by the Core worlds. The Colonies sit along major trade toutes, and some of them are extremely wealthy.

INNER Rest: When first settled, this area was known simply as the Rim and it was the frontier of galactic civilization for centuries. As colonization specad farther outward, the Inner Rim worlds prospered.


EXMASSION REGION: With competition for resources comes the need to expand, and the Expansion Region contains newer colonies sponsored by their coreward neighbors.

Mto Risti Many important worlds are found in the Mid Rim, including Naboo, Kashyyyk, Ithor, and Malastare. Because it is relatively far from the Core, travelers should be wary of pirates.

OUTER RIM TERRITORIESS The largest region of the known galaxy is the Outer Rim, which contains many strange and often savage worlds. Some of the most important worlds in the Confederacy of Independent Systems—otherwise known as the Separatists during the Clone Wars—were in this region.

UNKNOWN REGIONS: The westward arm of the galaxy is mapped but largely unexplored. Who knows what lurks in the dark spaces beyond the frontiers of galactic civilization?

WILD SPICES Beyond the Outer Rim lies the unmapped expanse of Wild Space. Explorers and carrographers seek their fortune here at their peril.



TIMELINE

This timeline describes the period of history covered in these maps, from the Clone Wars between the Republic and the Separatists, to the Galactic Civil War between the Empire and the Rebel Alliance, and beyond.

Dates in this book are given using the "ABY-BBY" dating

Dates in this book are given using the "ABY-BBY" dating system, which is centered on the Battle of Yavin, when the first Death Star was destroyed. Therefore, 5 BBY is five years before the Battle of Yavin, and 5 ABY is five years after.


The galaxy is governed by the Republic. On the capital world, Coruscant, senators from a thousand worlds meet to debate the future while the Jedi Order maintains peace and harmony.



The powerful Trade Federation, which controls galactic trade, bullies the remote world Naboo. Two Jedi, Qui-Gon Jinn and Obi-Wan Kenobi, are sent to negotiate peace. However, the Trade Federation tries to assassinate the Jedi and sends its battle droid armies to Naboo to capture Queen Padmé Amidala.



Qui-Gon Jinn and Obi-Wan
Kenobi rescue the queen but
are forced to flee. Their ship
needs repairs, so they stop
on the remote desert world
Tatooine. Here they meet a slave,
boy named Anakin Skywalker,
whose potential as a Jedi is the
greatest Qui-Gon has ever seen.
The Jedi win Anakin's freedom
and take him away with them.



The Jedi escort Queen Amidala to Coruscant, but she cannot persuade the Senate to help Naboo. She returns to her homeworld with Qui-Gon, Obi-Wan, Anakin, and their Gungan friend, Jar Jar Binks. The Gungans fight a battle against the Trade Federation's droid army as the queen retakes her palace.



A sinister and deadly assassin—the Sith Lord Darth Maul—has been tracking the Jedi. He and his master, Darth Sidious, are secretly behind the Trade Federation's invasion. In a fierce battle beneath the city of Theed, he slays Qui-Gon Jinn. But Obi-Wan cuts Darth Maul in half, seemingly destroying him.





The Gungans and the Naboo forces defeat the droid army with the help of Anakin Skywalker. The Trade Federation is forced to withdraw.

Senator Palpatine of Naboo is made Supreme Chancellor. Secretly, he is the evil Sith Lord Darth Sidious. He plans to start a galactic war to scare the Republic into building up the military he needs in order to seize absolute power for himself.



The former Jedi Master Count Dooku has sparked a crisis, with his Confederacy of Independent Systems—the socalled Separatists—threatening to split from the Republic. The Senate must decide whether or not to create an Army of the Republic. Padmé Amidala, who is now a senator, is a major opponent of this plan.



A series of attempts on Senator Amidala's life leads Obi-Wan Kenobi to the planet Kamino. Here, he discovers an army of clones. They were secretly ordered by a now-dead Jedi Master and are based on the bounty hunter Jango Fett, who is the assassin Kenobi has been seeking. He follows Fett to Geonosis.



Anakin, now a Jedi apprentice, is assigned to protect Padmé. They travel to Naboo together, where they begin to fall in love. But Anakin is troubled by dreams about his mother, Shmi, whom he was forced to leave behind on Tatooine many years ago.



On Tatooine, Anakin discovers that his mother has been kidnapped by the Sand People. He is unable to save her life, and in a rage, he slaughters the entire tribe.



Obi-Wan is captured on Geonosis by the Separatists. They also capture Anakin and Padmé when the couple tries to rescue Obi-Wan.




Jedi Master Mace Windu leads a team of Jedi to the rescue, backed by the clone army that now serves the Republic. Windu slays Fett, but Count Dooku escapes, pursued by Anakin Skywalker and Obi-Wan Kenobi.









HISTORICAL FIGURES

This turbulent period in the history of the galaxy produced many valiant heroes and terrifying villains. From the Clone Wars to the Galactic Civil War and beyond, here are some of the famous—and infamous faces in this book.



The ruthless and deadly Duros bounty hunter was famed for his exploits during the Clone Wars-a daring holocron theft from the Jedi Temple, a prison break on Coruscant, and the kidnap of the Republic's Supreme Chancellor, Palpatine. There was no job he would not take on-for the right price.



The faithful companion to Resistance pilot Poe Dameron, BB-8, a spherical astromech droid, was entrusted with the map to Luke Skywalker by his master. After meeting Rey and Finn, he managed to succeed in his mission. BB-8 was a clever and resourceful droid, well aware of his ability to charm.



ADMIRAL ACKBAR

A legendary soldier and brilliant

tactician. Ackbar rose to the rank of

admiral for the Alliance to Restore the


Republic, commanding the rebel fleet.

His exploits during the Clone Wars with

the Mon Calamari Guard helped Prince

Lee-Char win the planet's throne and

Jar Jar Binks met Qui-Gon Jinn and Obi-Wan Kenobi during the invasion of Naboo and became friends with the Jedi and Queen Amidala, whom he helped rescue. Later, he became a representative for his planet in the Galactic Senate, unwittingly helping Chancellor Palpatine seize absolute power.


and brought the Jedi into the war. Her

side. A heartbroken Padmé died shortly




A protocol droid built from spare parts by Anakin Skywalker, in his childhood on Tatooine, C-3PO was fluent in over seven million forms of communication. Despite his anxious nature, C-3PO played a pivotal role in the Galactic Civil War, alongside his constant companion and counterpart, R2-D2.




The roguish gambler Lando Calrissian lost his ship the Millennium Falcon to his friend Han Solo in a game of sabacc. Later, as Baron Administrator of Cloud City, he betrayed Solo to the Empire but soon had a change of heart. General Calrissian helped the rebels destroy the second Death Star at the Battle of Endor.



The legendary Wookiee Chewbacca fought for the Republic in the Clone Wars and later gained fame as one of the heroes of the Battle of Yavin. He and his friend Han Solo became key figures in the Rebellion. An ace pilot and engineer, Chewbacca was also a mighty warrior and crack shot with his bowcaster.



Poe Dameron was an ace pilot for the Republic who was recruited by General Organa for her Resistance organization. He helped secure the map to the location of Luke Skywalker, despite the First Order's capturing and interrogating him, and fired the shots that destroyed the Starkiller superweapon.



Dooku trained as the Padawan of Jedi Master Yoda and became a Jedi Master himself. He came to believe the Republic was corrupt and left to raise a Separatist army against it. As the Sith Lord Darth Tyranus, he was the apprentice of Darth Sidious until his master betrayed him. He was killed by Anakin Skywalker.




Boba was a clone of his "father," Jango Fett, and as a boy witnessed his death at the hands of Jedi Master Mace Windu. He grew up to become one of the galaxy's most dangerous bounty hunters. Near the end of the Galactic Civil War, he fell into a sarlace pit on Tatooine while working for Jabba the Hutt.



The galaxy's most feared bounty hunter, Jango Fett was chosen as the genetic template for the Republic's clone troopers as part of a plot by the Sith Lords Chancellor Palpatine and Count Dooku. He fought Obi-Wan Kenobi on Kamino and was killed during the Battle of Geonosis by Jedi Master Mace Windu.




Raised from infancy to be a stormtrooper for the First Order, FN-2187 was a model soldier until his first combat mission. He refused to fire on innocent people and fled the First Order with the Resistance pilot Poe Dameron, who gave him the name Finn. He then helped his new friends destroy Starkiller base.



Inquisitors were dark side-using Jedi hunters, employed by Emperor Palpatine to seek out survivors of Order 66. The Grand Inquisitor was sent to the planet Lothal to find Kanan Jarrus, but after a series of battles, Jarrus defeated him in a duel aboard the Star Destroyer Sovereign, and the Grand Inquisitor was destroyed.



The Kaleesh warrior Grievous was a fearsome cyborg, with almost all of his original body replaced by mechanical "upgrades." Trained in lightsaber combat by Count Dooku, Grievous became a key Separatist general, commanding vast droid armies. He was killed by Obi-Wan Kenobi near the end of the Clone Wars.




The vile gangster ruled a criminal empire from his palace on Tatooine. After a bounty hunter brought him Han Solo, the Hutt's former employee, Jabba hung Han frozen in carbonite on the wall of his throne room. When Luke Skywalker rescued Han, Princess Leia slayed the Hutt.




Caleb Dume was only a Padawan learner when Order 66 happened, and his master Depa Billaba was killed helping him escape. Taking the name Kanan Jarrus, he fled his old life, until events forced him to take up his lightsaber once more. His rebel cell became a serious threat to the Empire.



A powerful and unusual Jedi Master, Qui-Gon Jinn was trained by Count Dooku and in turn was the master of Obi-Wan Kenobi. He learned the secret of maintaining his consciousness after death, a power he passed on to Yoda and Kenobi. Jinn was slain by the Sith Darth Maul during the invasion of Naboo.




Famed as a wise negotiator and cunning warrior, Obi-Wan Kenobi fought with intelligence and courage in the Clone Wars. With the rise of the Empire, he took it upon himself to watch over Luke Skywalker and trained him as a Jedi. He sacrificed himself against Darth Vader to save Luke, but his spirit lived on.



Lobot had cybernetic implants put into his brain by the Empire, enabling him to run complex calculations for them. While helping Lando steal Emperor Palpatine's yacht, he was seriously injured and his cyborg brain took over. Later, he helped the crew of the Millennium Falcon escape Cloud City.



Maul, a Zabrak from Dathomir, was born to Talzin of the Nightsisters but kidnapped by Darth Sidious as a child. Through years of cruel training, he became a devastating Sith warrior and slew the Jedi Master Qui-Gon Jinn. He was then maimed by Obi-Wan Kenobi, only to rise again as a cyborg crime lord. Mon Mothma was senator for the planet Chandrila during the Clone Wars, but as Supreme Chancellor Palpatine tightened his grip on the Republic, she began to form a network of resistance. She became a key leader in the Alliance to Restore the Republic and later served as the first chancellor of the New Republic.



Hondo was a cunning Weequay pirate and leader of the Ohnaka Gang, operating from the Outer Rim planet Florrum. They engaged in kidnapping for ransom, robbery, black-market arms trading, and extortion. A born survivor, he lived through clashes with the Jedi, the Separatists, and Darth Maul.



Savage was a Nightbrother warrior who was infused with dark magicks by his mother, Talzin, and transformed into a monstrous warrior. He learned the dark side as an apprentice under Count Dooku and, later, his brother Maul. The brothers dueled Darth Sidious, who defeated them and slew Opress.



The Empire brutally massacred the Lasat people, from the Outer Rim world Lasan. One of the few survivors was Garazeb Orrelios, a member of the Lasan Honor Guard. A formidable warrior, the gruff but good-hearted Orrelios became a member of a rebel cell that came together on Lothal.



Leia was raised as a princess by her adoptive parents on Alderaan and grew up to become both a senator and a rebel leader. Her real father, Darth Vader, never knew the truth. After winning the Galactic Civil War, Leia married Han Solo and led the Resistance against the sinister First Order.



Born on Naboo, Sheev Palpatine became a senator and, through clever political scheming, Supreme Chancellor. Secretly, he was Sidious, Dark Lord of the Sith, controlling both sides in the Clone Wars and seizing absolute power as Emperor. He was destroyed by his former pupil Anakin Skywalker.



Alongside General Hux and Kylo Ren, Captain Phasma was one of the key commanders of the First Order. She was in charge of training stormtroopers and led them into battle herself. Her distinctive armor was coated with chromium salvaged from a starship once owned by Emperor Palpatine.



Heroic astromech droid R2-D2
witnessed some of the galaxy's most
crucial events, from the invasion of
Naboo and the Clone Wars to the rise
and fall of the Galactic Empire. He
accompanied both Anakin and Luke
Skywalker on adventures and was key in
efforts to destroy the Death Star.



At his birth, the son of Han Solo and Leia Organa was named Ben. His Jedi training with Luke Skywalker ended in tragedy when, seduced by the dark side, he betrayed the other students and became responsible for their destruction. As Kylo Ren, the First Order's enforcer, he killed his father on Starkiller base.




Rey grew up on the planet Jakku, where she had been left at an early age. She scavenged the ship graveyard for parts to trade to her guardian, the junkboss Unkar Plutt, and waited for her family. A chance encounter with a Resistance droid led her to leave the planet and discover her destiny as a Jedi.



Anakin Skywalker was discovered as a child slave on the planet Tatooine by the Jedi Master Qui-Gon Jinn. His incredible potential led to his being trained as a Jedi, and he became one of the Republic's greatest heroes. However, he came under the sway of the Sith Lord Darth Sidious and fell to the dark side.



The farm boy from Tatooine who longed for the stars became one of the galaxy's most important figures. The last Jedi Knight trained by Obi-Wan Kenobi and Yoda, he joined the Rebel Alliance; turned his father, Anakin Skywalker, back to the light; and overthrew the Emperor. Later, he withdrew from galactic affairs.



A smuggler, rogue, famed pilot, and crack shot, Han Solo became caught up in the Galactic Civil War when he was hired to take Obi-Wan Kenobi and Luke Skywalker to Alderaan. He joined the rebels, helped win the war, and married Princess Leia, but was later tragically struck down by his son, Ben.



The daughter of famed Twi'lek freedom fighter, Cham Syndulla, Hera grew up on her home planet Ryloth as the Clone Wars and Imperial occupation ravaged it. Hera decided to leave Ryloth in her ship, the *Ghost*, to fight the Empire and became a founding member of a rebel



The leader of Dathomir's Nightsisters, Mother Talzin was a powerful sorceress who wielded the dark side of the Force. She plotted both with and against the Sith Lords Sidious and Tyranus, who eventually sent Grievous to destroy her clan. She was killed saving her son, Darth Maul, from Palpatine and Dooku.




Grand Master Yoda assigned this young but talented Togruta Jedi to Anakin Skywalker as his Padawan learner. She served heroically in the Clone Wars before a sinister plot led her to leave the Order. Later, as the agent Fulcrum, she helped establish a network of rebels against Imperial tyranny.



Ruthlessly ambitious and highly intelligent, Wilhuff Tarkin rose through the ranks of the Imperial military to become one of the most powerful men in the galaxy. As Grand Moff, he commanded the first Death Star, destroying the planet Alderaan. He was killed when the battle station exploded.




Lor San Tekka was an explorer who was fascinated by the legends of the Jedi and became a member of the Church of the Force, which kept Jedi ideals alive in the age of the Empire. He possessed a map that could help locate Luke Skywalker and gave it to the Resistance before Kylo Ren struck him down.



The Togruta Jedi Master Shaak Ti was a member of the High Council during the Clone Wars and was responsible for the training of the Republic's clone army on the planet Kamino. Though a skilled and cunning warrior, she was killed by Darth Vader during the Jedi Purge as she meditated in the Temple.




A member of the Jedi High Council, Luminara Unduli was one of the most highly respected Jedi Masters of her time. Following the victory of Emperor Palpatine over the Jedi, Unduli was executed on Stygeon Prime and her image was used as a trap to draw in survivors of Order 66.



When Anakin Skywalker turned to the dark side, his new master dubbed him Darth Vader. Terribly injured on Mustafar, he was sealed into cyborg lifesupport armor and served the Emperor as his feared right hand. Later, he turned on his master, destroying him to save the life of his son, Luke Skywalker.



Born on Dathomir into the Force-using clan of Nightsisters, Ventress was apprenticed to the Sith Lord Count Dooku and became his assassin. Dooku and Ventress eventually tried to kill each other, and she struck out on her own as a bounty hunter. She died heroically, protecting the Jedi Quinlan Vos.



Jedi Master Mace Windu was known as one of the Order's greatest champions. His skill with a lightsaber and the Force was almost unmatched. He fought many key battles of the Clone Wars, including the raid on Geonosis, as a general. He was killed by Darth Sidious while trying to arrest the Sith Lord.



Sabine Wren was born into the Mandalorian warrior tradition. As a child, she joined the Imperial Academy as a cadet. However, the Empire's oppression led her to flee her home planet and join a cell of rebels on the planet Lothal. She was a weapons and explosives expert and a keen artist.




The Grand Master of the Jedi Council
was the wisest and most powerful of
them all. However, he failed to uncover
the Sith Lord Sidious and arrogantly
chose to face him in single combat. After
Palpatine fought him to a standstill,
Yoda retreated into exile, where he
eventually trained Luke Skywalker.

ABAFAR TO YAVIN 4

ABAFAR: A barren world rich in rhydonium. During the Clone Wars, the Separatists loaded a stolen freighter with this explosive and tried to use it to blow up a top Republic military conference. They were thwarted by D-Squad, a covert team of droids led by Colonel Meebur Gascon.

Dantooine: Once used by the Rebel Alliance as a base, it was the location given by Princess Leia to Grand Moff Tarkin when he demanded she reveal the rebel headquarters. Because Dantooine was too remote to demonstrate the Death Star's power, Tarkin targeted her home planet of Alderaan instead.

DATHOMIR: A mysterious world of jungles, swamps, and mountains, haunted by witches and rancors. Dathomir's Nightsisters were one of the known groups of Force-users who were neither Jedi nor Sith until conflict with Darth Tyranus and Darth Sidious led to one of their clans being massacred.



Mon Cala: The vast oceans of Mon Cala are home to the Mon Calamari and Quarren species. A bitter struggle between the two led to the groups' taking opposite sides during the Clone Wars. The Republic defeated the Separatists, and Lee-Char of the Mon Calamari proved himself in battle, becoming king.

The planet suffered under the Empire, and the Mon Calamari became key allies of the rebels. Admiral Ackbar was commander of the rebel fleet at the Battle of Endor.

Mon Calamari ships were some of the largest and most powerful in the rebel fleet. MORABAND: The desolate homeworld of the Sith holds many evil secrets. In the Valley of the Dark Lords, the tombs of powerful Sith are haunted by the presence of the dark side. Yoda traveled here as part of his quest to discover the secret of immortality and encountered a vision of Darth Bane.

MORTIS: Discovered by the Jedi Anakin Skywalker, Mortis is a mysterious realm resembling a bizarre planet whose landscape changes constantly. It was home to three powerful Force wielders, the Daughter, the Son, and the Father, who represented the light, the dark, and balance, respectively.

Quermian species—tall, pale humanoids with long necks and two pairs of arms.

Quermian Jedi Master Yarael Poof was a respected member of the Jedi Council, known for his skill with diplomacy, illusions, and mind tricks. FELUCIA: Felucia's position in the middle of an important hyperspace lane made it a key target during the Clone Wars. Many battles were fought for control of it. The planet itself is a farm world with great jungles of fungus. It is noted for its production of the valuable healing herb nysillin.

ITHOR: The peaceful Ithorian people, sometimes known as "hammerheads," tend to the sacred jungles of their homeworlds. They are known for their remarkable farming technology. The Galactic Empire forced them to reveal their secrets in return for sparing the planet a devastating invasion.

Jelucan: A world of ice and towering mountain peaks.
Jelucan was settled in two waves of colonists—the second-wavers became rich miners while the first-wavers clung to their more rigid mountain traditions. It is notable as the homeworld of star-crossed lovers Thane Kyrell and Ciena Ree.

Lola Sayu: From orbit, Lola Sayu is a purple jewel of a planet. It is volcanic, with a cracked surface through which lakes of lava bubble up. It was once the site of a Jedi prison called the Citadel. When the Separatists took over the planet, they used it to hold Jedi prisoners of their own.

MARIDUN: A grass-covered planet, home to the peace-loving Lurmen. It was used to test a new Separatist weapon, the Defoliator, which destroyed life but not technology—like the Separatists' battle droids. The scheme was foiled by the Jedi Anakin Skywalker, Ahsoka Tano, and Aayla Secura.



Raxus: The capital of the Confederacy of Independent Systems during the Clone Wars, Raxus is a beautiful world of forests, plains, and oceans.

From here, Count Dooku sparked the Separatist Crisis that led to the Clone Wars and the fall of the Republic. Scipio: The InterGalactic
Banking Clan, one of the most
important organizations in the
Outer Rim, was based on the
icy planet Scipio. During the
Clone Wars, this key Separatist
planet was captured by the
Republic, giving Chancellor
Palpatine control of the galaxy's
largest banking system.

SERENNO: A forested world that was home to Count Dooku, one of the central figures of the Clone Wars. An aristocrat who gave up his title to join the Jedi Order, he later became disillusioned and left to form the Separatists. He was also, secretly, Darth Tyranus, apprentice to Darth Sidious.


STYGEON PRIME: The snow-capped mountains of Stygeon
Prime hid the high-security
prison known as the Spire.
Darth Sidious imprisoned his
former apprentice Darth Maul
here. He also kept the remains
of Jedi Master Luminara Unduli
here to lure in any Jedi who
survived the Order's destruction.

YAVIN 4: The small jungle moon that served as a base for the Rebel Alliance for its assault on the first Death Star.


This rebel base location was the crucial secret held back by the rebel leader and senator Leia Organa during her interrogation by Darth Vader.











ALDERAAN

<u>то</u> Тетн ALDERAAN: Known for its stunning natural beauty,
Alderaan was one of the oldest members of the Galactic
Republic, a peaceful world whose people valued art and culture. Because of its leaders' secret support for the Rebel
Alliance, it was destroyed by the Empire using the Death Star.

Antar 4: Scene of the infamous Antar Atrocity, carried out by Grand Moff Tarkin as a warning to former Separatists.

BALNAB: A primitive world once visited by C-3PO and R2-D2. The planet's ruler is a hologram created by a group of stranded pit droids.

CORELLIA: An important Core world known for its ships and pilots. Han Solo and Wedge Antilles were born here, and the Corellian Engineering Corporation manufactured the YT-1300 light freighter the Millennium Falcon, known as one of the fastest ships in the galaxy.



KUAT: The shipyards of Kuat are famous throughout the galaxy. Here, the Republic's Acclamator assault ships and the Empire's Star Destroyers were built. A vast man-made ring of factories and spacedocks encircles the planet, allowing huge vessels to be built in orbit.

LOTHAL: A quiet and peaceful agricultural world known for its jogan fruit. At first, Lothal welcomed the Galactic Empire. However, the Empire soon began to oppress and exploit Lothal, strip-mining it for minerals. A famous cell of rebels formed here and won notable victories against the Empire.

MANDALORE: The Mandalorian people were once renowned as fierce and deadly warriors. However, the New Mandalorians have tried to put the violence of the past behind them. They are opposed by terrorists like Death Watch, operating from their exile on Mandalore's moon, Concordia.

Onderon's thick jungles are inhabited by deadly creatures. The humans on this planet live in cities protected by thick walls, such as the capital city, Iziz. A key rebel leader, Saw Gerrera, waged a guerrilla campaign here against the occupying Separatist forces with the help of the Jedi.

ORD MANTELL: A mountainous world covered by thick, pinkish clouds and inhabited by Falleen and humans, Ord Mantell is well known as a base of the Black Sun gang. During the Clone Wars, Maul's Shadow Collective took over the Black Sun and fought a battle here against the Separatists.

CORUSCANT: Capital of the Republic and, later, the Galactic Empire. It is a planet covered by a vast city of skyscrapers, rising miles into the sky.

After the Galactic Civil War, the Galactic Senate of the New Republic moved from system to system on a rotating basis. GAREL: Briefly the hiding place of the rebel cell led by Hera Syndulla and Kanan Jarrus, during the Imperial years.

GORSE: A mining world, with one side permanently in darkness and the other in blazing sunlight. Kanan Jarrus met Hera Syndulla here. HOSNIAN PRIME: With the
Empire defeated, a New
Republic rose from the ashes. Its
capital was changed by election
every few years. While the
Senate was based on Hosnian
Prime, the First Order used
Starkiller base to destroy the
system, the Senate, and much of
the Republic's fleet.

JEDHA: An ancient world, Jedha was once a place of holy pilgrimage. During Imperial occupation, extremist rebel Saw Gerrera had a hideout here.

KASHYYYK: The Wookiee homeworld, known for its majestic wroshyr trees. Cities spiral around their huge trunks. KESSEL: One side of this world is lush and beautiful. Elegant palaces and their exquisitely tended grounds sit among green forests and crystal lakes. On the other side of the world, vast colonies of slaves labor in the infamous spice mines. Spice smugglers can make vast profits on the "Kessel Run."

MANDALORE LOTHAL SALEUCAMI GAREL SHANTIPOLE KASHYYYK ONDERON RUUSAN GORSE ANTAR 4 TETH

RUUSAN: During the Clone
Wars, one of Ruusan's three
moons hid a Separatist base,
Skytop Station, eavesdropping
on Republic transmissions.
General Grievous took the
captured R2-D2 here to unlock
the Republic's secrets in his
databanks. The droid was
rescued by Anakin Skywalker.

SALEUCAMI: Many people who wished to escape the chaos of the Clone Wars settled on remote Saleucami, including clone trooper Cut Lawquane, who deserted to raise a family. Eventually, war did reach the planet as the Republic and the Separatists clashed in one of the final battles of the conflict.


SHANTIPOLE: Lightning storms rage among the mountain peaks of Shantipole, and the atmosphere is highly dangerous for piloting starships. Here, away from the watchful gaze of the Empire, the Mon Calamari engineer Quarrie invented the prototype Blade Wing—or B-wing fighter—for the rebels.

Shill: The homeworld of the Togruta, who are instantly recognizable thanks to their brightly patterned skin, headtails, and montrals—hollow, cone-shaped horns that allow the Togruta to track movement. Two famous Jedi were from Shili—Jedi Master Shaak Ti and the Padawan Ahsoka Tano.

TETH: A mountainous jungle planet in a Hutt-controlled area of Wild Space. Teth was once inhabited by the bizarre monks of the B'omarr Order, whose brains were transplanted into spider-like droid bodies. It was the scene of the daring rescue of the infant Rotta the Hutt by Anakin Skywalker.













ABEDNEDO TO TATOOINE

ABEDNEDO: Emperor Palpatine's last cruel order, Operation:
Cinder, was a revenge scheme that was to be put into effect upon his death. It targeted entire worlds for destruction, including Abednedo. An Abednedo pilot, Ello Asty, later flew for the Resistance at Starkiller base.

BARDOTTA: A frozen, mountainous planet whose people are fascinated by mysticism. During the Clone Wars, Jedi Master Mace Windu and Jar Jar Binks foiled a plot by a sinister cult to drain Bardottan Queen Julia's life energy and channel it into their leader, Mother Talzin. BOTHAWUI: Dense rings of asteroids around the gas giant Bothawui offer a masterclass for pilots, who must be highly skilled to navigate them. It was the scene of a major space battle during the Clone Wars, in which the tactical genius of Anakin Skywalker helped defeat General Grievous.



JAKKU: Jakku is littered with the wreckage of starships that fell from orbit during the last great battle of the Galactic Civil War. Scavengers comb the debris for salvage. One scavenger, Rey, was abandoned on Jakku as a child and was later caught up in the struggle between the Resistance and the First Order.

MALASTARE: The homeworld of the Dug species, Malastare is a forest world whose core is rich in valuable fuel. During the Clone Wars, the Republic tested an electro-proton bomb here, designed to knock out droid armies. However, it awakened the colossal Zillo Beast, which then went on a rampage. NABOO: One of the galaxy's most beautiful worlds, with lush grasslands, winding rivers, and tall waterfalls. The crust of the planet is riddled with holes and passages, which are filled with water. These can be used as a quick means of submarine travel from one part of the planet to another.

Naboo was the homeworld of the Sith Lord Darth Sidious. Born Sheev Palpatine, his scheming made him first a senator, then Supreme Chancellor, then Emperor. The Trade Federation's invasion of his home planet was one of the first moves in his grand plan to seize control of the galaxy. Quarzite: The surface of
Quarzite cannot support life.
Its inhabitants, the Belugans
and the Kage, fought a long war
for control of the underground
crystal caverns. Access to these
caverns is only possible using
a giant turbolift, which leads
from an orbiting space station
down into the planet's crust.

CEREA: A beautiful world, largely unspoiled by the ravages of technology. It is home to the Cerean people, whose towering cone-shaped skulls contain a binary brain. Ki-Adi-Mundi was a famous Cerean Jedi Master who won many victories during the Clone Wars with his Galactic Marines.

CHRISTOPHSIS: Crystal forests cover the surface of Christophsis with tall jagged peaks of turquoise rising from fields of hexagonal "tiles." A fierce battle was fought here in the early days of the Clone Wars, in which generals Kenobi and Skywalker triumphed over the Separatist Whorm Loathsom.

DEVARON: A green and pleasant, world of forests, rivers, and tropical jungles, inhabited by the Devaronian species. The Jedi Temple on Devaron was attacked during the Clone Wars by the monstrous Savage Opress, who slew Jedi Master Halsey. Later, Luke Skywalker honed his lightsaber skills here.

ENDOR: This small forest moon orbits the gas giant of the same name. It is home to the furry Ewoks, the swamp-dwelling Duloks, and the Yuzzums of the grasslands. Endor was famously the scene of the titanic battle in which the second Death Star was destroyed and Emperor Palpatine perished.

GEONOSIS: An arid world whose insectoid inhabitants were skilled in engineering. The vast factories of Geonosis created millions of battle droids for the Separatists, and the Empire began to construct the first Death Star in orbit. Later, the planet was sterilized, killing almost all life.

BOTHAWUI MALASTARE RODIA CHRISTOPHSIS TATOOINE Naboo GEONOSIS

RATTATAK: A dry, rocky world plagued by the attacks of pirates and warlords. One pirate, Hal'Sted, owned a slave—the young Asajj Ventress. When Hal'Sted was killed on Rattatak, the Jedi Ky Narec took in Ventress and began to train her. His death at the hands of pirates led her to fall to the dark side.

RODIA: A warm, damp planet of swamps and jungles, Rodia is the homeworld of the Rodian species. During the Clone Wars, Rodia wavered between supporting the Republic and supporting the Separatists, but eventually Senator Padmé Amidala helped sway them to the Republic's cause.


TAKODANA: Situated halfway between the Core worlds and the wild frontier, Takodana is a popular stop for travelers, explorers, fugitives, and smugglers. The famous pirate Maz Kanata owned a castle here, where strange beings from all over the galaxy gathered to relax or do business.

TATOOINE: What little moisture there is on dusty Tatooine has to be extracted from the air by vaporators and is crucial to the survival of life. Humans and others scratch out a living here alongside the native Tusken Raiders—also known as the Sand People—and the Jawas who scavenge the sands.

A largely lawless world,
Tatooine is controlled by the
Hutt clans and is a hub of
criminal activity. Smugglers
and bounty hunters flock to
shady dives in ports like Mos
Eisley while gamblers bet on
deadly podraces and back-room
sabacc games in Mos Espa and
elsewhere.

















ANDELM IV TO UTAPAU

Andelm IV: A remote world known for its beetles, a source of the rare mineral dedlanite. During the Galactic Civil War, a crime lord named Jaum enslaved the population, forcing them to harvest dedlanite for the Empire. His plans were foiled by the Wookiee Chewbacca and his friend Zarro.

ARKANIS: Rain falls endlessly on gloomy Arkanis, ranging from drizzle to thunderstorms. The Empire built an academy here, run by Commandant Brendol Hux, to train a generation of elite officers. It was also the site of Project Harvester, where Force-sensitive children were brought for mysterious purposes.

BESPIN: A gas giant with no land, just layers of dense gas through which strange creatures swim. Valuable tibanna gas is collected from vast creatures called beldons and processed in the floating habitats in the upper, breathable layer of atmosphere, including the famous Cloud City.



KAMINO: This world is not on any maps. As part of an elaborate plot by Darth Sidious, it was erased from the Jedi Archives and only rediscovered when Obi-Wan Kenobi was investigating the attempted assassination of the Naboo senator Padmé Amidala. Kenobi traced the would-be

assassin to the Wild Space
planet Kamino, an endless
ocean whose inhabitants had
mastered the science of cloning.
The Kaminoans had been
paid to create a clone army for
the Republic, using the DNA
of the bounty hunter Jango
Fett—the assassin Kenobi was
following.

Mustafar: Lava spews from the volcanoes that cover Mustafar's surface while swarms of droids harvest rare minerals from the molten rock. Despite the searing heat of this harsh world, it is inhabited by the native Mustafarians, who labor in the mines and factories and live in underground caverns

hollowed out by rock-eating lava fleas.

Many dark deeds have taken place on Mustafar. Darth Vader betrayed and slew the Separatist Council here, ending the Clone Wars. He was then defeated and horribly maimed by Obi-Wan Kenobi.

Polis Massa: Once a planet, Polis Massa was mysteriously shattered into an asteroid field. A scientific base here studies the disaster, and following Order 66, Yoda and Obi-Wan Kenobi found safety at the research station. It was here that Luke Skywalker and Leia Organa were born. DAGOBAH: Grand Master Yoda once described Dagobah as "one of the purest places in the galaxy." He first came here toward the end of the Clone Wars, drawn by a strange message from his old friend Qui-Gon Jinn, who had died many years earlier. Jinn had discovered the secret to

maintaining his identity after death and set Yoda on the path to discover it for himself.

Following his failure to defeat Emperor Palpatine, Yoda exiled himself to Dagobah to meditate on the Force until a new hope could arise. It was here that he met Luke Skywalker. D'QAR: An obscure, tree-covered planet with no intelligent life and far from the main space lanes, D'Qar is of little interest. This made it a perfect choice as a secret base for the Rebel Alliance and later the Resistance—making it a target for the First Order's Starkiller weapon.

ERIADU: A once-savage wilderness of a world, until colonists tamed it. Among the early pioneers were the Tarkin family, who formed their own militia to protect against pirates and the local wildlife. Wilhuff Tarkin grew up here and learned many harsh lessons in survival.

HOTH: The frozen world
Hoth was chosen as the new
headquarters of the Rebel
Alliance following the Battle of
Yavin. The base was discovered
by an Imperial probe droid, and
Darth Vader moved swiftly to
invade the planet. The rebels
only narrowly escaped the Echo
Base's destruction.

D'QAR ARKANIS RYLOTH ANDELM IV

RYLOTH: Ryloth has seen more than its share of war. During the Clone Wars, it was a battleground between the Republic and the Separatists as Mace Windu and his forces fought to liberate the planet. Later, freedom fighter Cham Syndulla opposed the Empire's cruel occupation.

A plot by Syndulla and his Free Ryloth group led to Emperor Palpatine and Darth Vader crash-landing on the planet after the Star Destroyer they were traveling in, the *Perilous*, was sabotaged and destroyed. However, the Lords of the Sith were able to escape the assassination attempt.

SULLUST: A barren world of volcanoes and lakes whose people live in vast underground cities. Half of all Sullustans work for the SoroSuub technology corporation.
Sullustans are well known as pilots. Nien Nunb famously copiloted the Millennium Falcon at the battle of Endor.

UTAPAU: Hyperwind storms batter the surface of Utapau, forcing many of the planet's inhabitants—the Utai and Pau'ans—to live in the giant sinkholes that lead down into the planet's crust. The Amani, recent settlers on Utapau, are hardy enough to dwell above ground in the grasslands.

During the Clone Wars, Utapau was an important base for the Separatists, and it was here that Obi-Wan Kenobi tracked down General Grievous and challenged him to a duel. After a fierce battle, the Jedi Master managed to tear open the cyborg's armor and destroy him using his own blaster.
