INTRODUCTION

The Graf Archive covers the majority of the moon Orchis 2. Its endless shelves, galleries, and databanks contain texts, artworks, antiques, and preserved plants and animals from every sector of the galaxy.

Items that cannot be immediately identified are moved to the underground Shadow Stacks, where they wait to be processed, often for many years. Venturing into these dusty basements is an important part of an Archivist's training, a kind of final exam. The challenge is to come back with an unexpected treasure. It can be dangerous, as one young student discovered when the mummified ghest he was examining turned out to be merely hibernating. . . .

These ancient hand-drawn maps were unearthed from the Shadow Stacks by a far luckier student. The Head Curator's theory is that they are the work of the great Ithorian artist Gammit Chond. We know very little about Chond—few of his works have survived—but these maps show much of his characteristic style and flair.

Chond never traveled off-world, and it is rumored that he never ventured more than a day's walk from his home. However, he was fascinated by the tales of travelers, and many of his works depict their stories of adventure in the rest of the galaxy.

Of course, these maps are not strictly accurate. No one should try to cross the Jundland Wastes using Chond's map of Tatooine. The artist was more interested in the feel of these strange worlds and the galaxy-shaking events that took place on them.

These maps seem to be centered on the saga of the legendary Skywalker family. While many of the things Chond has included are facts, some may merely be tales spun by explorers. Together, it all presents a unique view of a fascinating slice of history.

After several years of painstaking restoration, it is my great privilege, and that of the Graf Archive, to present this never-before-seen collection of art to the galaxy.

THE GALAXY

THE GALAXY IS GENERALLY THOUGHT TO BE DIVIDED INTO THE FOLLOWING REGIONS. GALACTIC NORTH IS THE DIRECTION TOWARD THE TOP OF THIS CHART.

DEEP CORE: Densely packed stars rotate around the super-massive black hole at the heart of the galaxy. It is dangerous to navigate, and few travelers venture this far coreward.

CORE WORLDS: The richest and most important worlds cluster around the edges of the Deep Core. These include Coruscant, Corellia, Kuat, Hosnian Prime, and other key systems.

COLONIES: This region contains planets colonized by the Core worlds. The Colonies sit along major trade routes, and some of them are extremely wealthy.

INNER RIM: When first settled, this area was known simply as the Rim and it was the frontier of galactic civilization for centuries. As colonization spread farther outward, the Inner Rim worlds prospered.

EXPANSION REGION: With competition for resources comes the need to expand, and the Expansion Region contains newer colonies sponsored by their coreward neighbors.

MID RIM: Many important worlds are found in the Mid Rim, including Naboo, Kashyyyk, Ithor, and Malastare. Because it is relatively far from the Core, travelers should be wary of pirates.

OUTER RIM TERRITORIES: The largest region of the known galaxy is the Outer Rim, which contains many strange and often savage worlds. Some of the most important worlds in the Confederacy of Independent Systems—otherwise known as the Separatists during the Clone Wars—were in this region.

UNKNOWN REGIONS: The westward arm of the galaxy is mapped but largely unexplored. Who knows what lurks in the dark spaces beyond the frontiers of galactic civilization?

WILD SPACE: Beyond the Outer Rim lies the unmapped expanse of Wild Space. Explorers and cartographers seek their fortune here at their peril.



TIMELINE

This timeline describes the period of history covered in these maps, from the Clone Wars between the Republic and the Separatists, to the Galactic Civil War between the Empire and the Rebel Alliance, and beyond.

Dates in this book are given using the "ABY-BBY" dating system, which is centered on the Battle of Yavin, when the first Death Star was destroyed. Therefore, 5 BBY is five years before the Battle of Yavin, and 5 ABY is five years after.

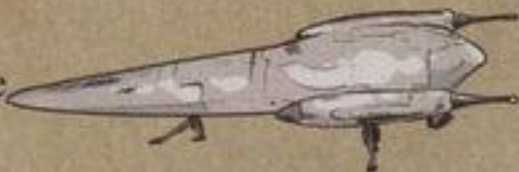
32 BBY The galaxy is governed by the Republic. On the capital world, Coruscant, senators from a thousand worlds meet to debate the future while the Jedi Order maintains peace and harmony.



The powerful Trade Federation, which controls galactic trade, bullies the remote world Naboo. Two Jedi, Qui-Gon Jinn and Obi-Wan Kenobi, are sent to negotiate peace. However, the Trade Federation tries to assassinate the Jedi and sends its battle droid armies to Naboo to capture Queen Padmé Amidala.



Qui-Gon Jinn and Obi-Wan Kenobi rescue the queen but are forced to flee. Their ship needs repairs, so they stop on the remote desert world Tatooine. Here they meet a slave boy named Anakin Skywalker, whose potential as a Jedi is the greatest Qui-Gon has ever seen. The Jedi win Anakin's freedom and take him away with them.



The Jedi escort Queen Amidala to Coruscant, but she cannot persuade the Senate to help Naboo. She returns to her homeworld with Qui-Gon, Obi-Wan, Anakin, and their Gungan friend, Jar Jar Binks. The Gungans fight a battle against the Trade Federation's droid army as the queen retakes her palace.



A sinister and deadly assassin—the Sith Lord Darth Maul—has been tracking the Jedi. He and his master, Darth Sidious, are secretly behind the Trade Federation's invasion. In a fierce battle beneath the city of Theed, he slays Qui-Gon Jinn. But Obi-Wan cuts Darth Maul in half, seemingly destroying him.



32 BBY The Gungans and the Naboo forces defeat the droid army with the help of Anakin Skywalker. The Trade Federation is forced to withdraw.



22 BBY Senator Palpatine of Naboo is made Supreme Chancellor. Secretly, he is the evil Sith Lord Darth Sidious. He plans to start a galactic war to scare the Republic into building up the military he needs in order to seize absolute power for himself.



The former Jedi Master Count Dooku has sparked a crisis, with his Confederacy of Independent Systems—the so-called Separatists—threatening to split from the Republic. The Senate must decide whether or not to create an Army of the Republic. Padmé Amidala, who is now a senator, is a major opponent of this plan.



A series of attempts on Senator Amidala's life leads Obi-Wan Kenobi to the planet Kamino. Here, he discovers an army of clones. They were secretly ordered by a now-dead Jedi Master and are based on the bounty hunter Jango Fett, who is the assassin Kenobi has been seeking. He follows Fett to Geonosis.



Anakin, now a Jedi apprentice, is assigned to protect Padmé. They travel to Naboo together, where they begin to fall in love. But Anakin is troubled by dreams about his mother, Shmi, whom he was forced to leave behind on Tatooine many years ago.



On Tatooine, Anakin discovers that his mother has been kidnapped by the Sand People. He is unable to save her life, and in a rage, he slaughters the entire tribe.



Obi-Wan is captured on Geonosis by the Separatists. They also capture Anakin and Padmé when the couple tries to rescue Obi-Wan.



Jedi Master Mace Windu leads a team of Jedi to the rescue, backed by the clone army that now serves the Republic. Windu slays Fett, but Count Dooku escapes, pursued by Anakin Skywalker and Obi-Wan Kenobi.



22 BBY

The Jedi catch up with Dooku, but he reveals that he is the Sith Lord Darth Tyranus, the new apprentice of Darth Sidious. He easily defeats both Anakin and Obi-Wan. It is only the last-minute intervention of Grand Master Yoda that saves them. Dooku is forced to flee, but his work is done. The Republic now has its army.



On Naboo, Anakin marries Padmé Amidala in secret. Meanwhile, the Clone Wars have begun as the Separatists under Count Dooku battle Palpatine's Republic armies.



The armies of the Republic are now led by the Jedi. Master Kenobi and Jedi Knight Skywalker defeat a Separatist invasion of the planet Christophsis with the help of Ahsoka Tano, Skywalker's new Padawan apprentice.



The Separatists attempt to turn the planet Rodia against the Republic, capturing Senator Amidala. She escapes with the help of Jar Jar Binks and keeps Rodia's support.



21 BBY

With the help of the Twi'lek freedom fighter Cham Syndulla, Master Mace Windu retakes the planet Ryloth from the Separatists. Their heroic actions are long remembered in song among the Twi'lek people.



Republic forces launch a massive attack on Geonosis, the home of the Separatists' droid armies. They destroy the vast battle-droid factories.



20 BBY

The Nightsisters of Dathomir attempt to assassinate Count Dooku. In revenge, he sends his army, led by General Grievous, to destroy them. Despite the witch Old Daka raising an army of the undead to oppose his droids, Grievous is successful.



The former Sith Lord Darth Maul, who was thought to have perished during the Battle of Naboo, resurfaces with his fearsome apprentice, Savage Opress. Now equipped with cyborg legs, he seeks revenge on his one-time master, Darth Sidious, and his enemy Obi-Wan Kenobi.



20 BBY

Onderon's king, Sanjay Rash, sides with the Separatists. With the help of Ahsoka Tano, a group of rebels led by Steela Gerrera and her brother Saw fights bravely to resist them. The Onderon rebels would eventually form part of the Rebel Alliance.



19 BBY

Maul's Shadow Collective, formed of Death Watch members and various criminal gangs, takes over the planet Mandalore. As revenge on Obi-Wan Kenobi, Maul kills Duchess Satine Kryze, for whom Kenobi had strong feelings. Maul's victory is short-lived, as Darth Sidious arrives to defeat both him and Opress.



Ahsoka Tano is framed for a Separatist bombing by the traitorous Jedi Padawan Barriss Offee. Though her innocence is eventually proven by her master, Anakin Skywalker, she decides to leave the Jedi Order.



The Separatists attack Coruscant and kidnap Chancellor Palpatine. Skywalker and Kenobi mount a rescue. Skywalker defeats Dooku in single combat, and Palpatine goads him into killing the Count, who was secretly his own apprentice.



Though he is the hero of the battle of Coruscant, Anakin is troubled by the Jedi's mistrust of him and his mentor Chancellor Palpatine. He is also plagued by dreams that seem to predict the death of his wife, Padmé.



Anakin discovers that Palpatine is Darth Sidious, but the Sith Lord promises he can help save Padmé. When Mace Windu tries to arrest the Chancellor, Anakin helps destroy Master Windu. He falls to the dark side and his new master names him Darth Vader.



Vader is sent to the Jedi Temple to massacre all those he finds there. Meanwhile, Palpatine issues Order 66 to the clone army—a secret command enforced by a chip in the clones' brains that compels them to assassinate the Jedi. Almost all the Jedi perish, though Obi-Wan Kenobi and Grand Master Yoda survive.



19 BBY On Utapau, Obi-Wan Kenobi's clone troops have cornered General Grievous, but they turn their fire on Kenobi as Order 66 is issued. Obi-Wan escapes and duels Grievous, killing the cyborg.



Grand Master Yoda goes to the Senate on Coruscant to confront Darth Sidious, but he is unable to defeat the Sith Lord in combat. The Jedi retreats and exiles himself to the swampy planet Dagobah.



Vader travels to the lava world Mustafar, where he slays the Separatist leaders, ending the Clone Wars for his master. Obi-Wan follows him and defeats him in an epic duel. Vader's injuries are severe and require him to wear a black cyborg suit of armor to survive.



Padmé Amidala gives birth to twins, Luke and Leia, but does not survive. Luke is hidden on Tatooine with the Lars family, and Leia is adopted by Senator Bail Organa of Alderaan.



Supreme Chancellor Palpatine declares himself the Galactic Emperor.



5 BBY On the remote planet Lothal, a group of rebels led by Hera Syndulla of Ryloth and the former Jedi Padawan Kanan Jarrus is formed. Ezra Bridger, an orphaned street thief, joins the crew of their ship, the *Ghost*, and begins to train in the ways of the Jedi.



4 BBY After many battles, Kanan Jarrus is captured by the Grand Inquisitor, a fearsome Jedi hunter. He is taken aboard Grand Moff Tarkin's flagship, the *Sovereign*, in orbit above Mustafar. A daring raid by his friends frees Jarrus, who then defeats the Inquisitor in combat. The Inquisitor and the *Sovereign* are both destroyed.



0 BBY A covert team of rebel agents is tasked with a crucial mission—to steal the plans of the Empire's new battle station, the Death Star. The mission is led by Cassian Andor and Jyn Erso. The Rogue One team goes to the planet Jedha.



0 BBY Darth Vader captures the *Tantive IV* and its passenger Princess Leia Organa, the senator from Alderaan. He accuses her of being a rebel traitor who possesses the Death Star plans, but the princess has already sent them off the ship, in her droid R2-D2.



R2-D2 and his counterpart, C-3PO, meet Luke Skywalker on Tatooine and take him to meet Obi-Wan Kenobi. When the Empire kills his aunt and uncle, Luke decides to train as a Jedi and to fight for the rebels against the Empire.



Luke, Obi-Wan, R2-D2, and C-3PO travel to Mos Eisley spaceport, where they hire Han Solo and Chewbacca to take them and the secret plans to the rebels on Alderaan. They travel in Solo's ship, the *Millennium Falcon*, to Alderaan, only to discover that the planet has been destroyed by the Death Star. The crew rescues Leia from Imperial custody and they flee to the *Millennium Falcon*.



Obi-Wan confronts his former pupil, Darth Vader. He sacrifices himself, becoming one with the Force, as his friends make their escape. The Empire tracks the *Falcon* to the moon Yavin 4.



As the Death Star closes in on their base, the rebels launch a desperate starfighter raid against the battle station. Using the Force, Luke Skywalker fires the shot that destroys it, earning a key victory for the Rebellion.



3 ABY Darth Vader sends probe droids across the galaxy and eventually locates the new rebel base on Hoth. His invasion force is able to destroy it, but not before the rebels escape. Meanwhile, Luke is visited by the spirit of Obi-Wan Kenobi, who tells him to travel to Dagobah.



Luke meets Yoda on Dagobah and begins his Jedi training. Han, Leia, Chewbacca, and the droids stop at Bespin to repair the *Falcon*, unaware that Vader's bounty hunter Boba Fett has tracked them there.



3 ABY

Vader captures Luke's friends and freezes Han Solo in carbonite. Han's friend the Baron Administrator of Cloud City, Lando Calrissian, struggles with his conscience as Boba Fett takes Solo away as a trophy for Jabba the Hutt.



Luke travels to Cloud City to rescue his friends. He confronts Vader, who defeats him in a duel. Vader reveals that he is Luke's father and Luke narrowly escapes in the *Millennium Falcon*.



4 ABY

Leia, Lando, Chewbacca, R2-D2, and Luke rescue Han Solo from Jabba's palace on Tatooine, slaying the vile gangster. Luke is now a full-fledged Jedi Knight.



Luke returns to Dagobah, where his master Yoda has reached the end of his life. The ancient Jedi tells Luke about his family—including the fact that Leia is his sister—and becomes one with the Force.



The Rebel Alliance is informed that a second Death Star is nearing completion and that the Emperor will be on board. The rebels plan to destroy it in an all-out attack. Their fleet assembles for the raid, without realizing that it is a trap and the battle station is already operational.



Han Solo leads a commando team to the sanctuary moon of Endor to destroy the shield generator protecting the Death Star. The rebels meet the Ewoks, who help them.



Luke Skywalker strikes down his father, Darth Vader, but refuses to kill him, knowing that would lead him to the dark side. The Emperor decides to kill Luke, but Anakin Skywalker cannot bear to see his son destroyed and instead sacrifices his own life to defeat the Emperor.



Luke escapes the Death Star. With the shield down, Lando Calrissian and Wedge Antilles destroy the battle station. Not long afterward, the Empire is finally defeated at the Battle of Jakku, and a New Republic is formed.



34 ABY

Kylo Ren, the dark enforcer of the First Order, seeks a map to the location of Luke Skywalker, who has withdrawn from galactic affairs. However, the explorer Lor San Tekka has already given it to the Resistance pilot Poe Dameron and his droid, BB-8.



A First Order stormtrooper, FN-2187, and a scavenger, Rey, are brought together on Jakku with BB-8. They flee the First Order in a stolen ship, the *Millennium Falcon*, found in a junkyard. Soon they are intercepted by Han Solo and Chewbacca.



Han Solo takes FN-2187—now Finn—and Rey to Takodana. He asks Maz Kanata to arrange passage for BB-8's precious data. The First Order learns of this, and Kylo Ren attacks, capturing Rey and destroying Maz's castle.



The Resistance must attack the First Order's superweapon, Starkiller base, after it destroys the Senate along with the Hosnian system. A small team will travel to the base to take down the planetary shields so that fighters can attack.



Finn, Han Solo, and Chewbacca fly the *Millennium Falcon* to Starkiller base and meet Rey, who has freed herself from Kylo Ren's clutches. Together, they manage to take down the planetary shields and plant explosives.



Han Solo pleads with his son, Ben—now known as Kylo Ren—to turn away from the dark side. But Ren embraces the darkness within himself and slays his father.



With her Force abilities suddenly awakened by the danger, Rey takes the lightsaber of Luke Skywalker and defeats Kylo Ren in battle.



Poe Dameron leads his X-wing squadron in an attack run on the Starkiller and fires the shots that destroy the monstrous weapon. Rey, Finn, and Chewbacca escape just as the base explodes.



HISTORICAL FIGURES

This turbulent period in the history of the galaxy produced many valiant heroes and terrifying villains. From the Clone Wars to the Galactic Civil War and beyond, here are some of the famous—and infamous—faces in this book.



ADMIRAL ACKBAR

A legendary soldier and brilliant tactician, Ackbar rose to the rank of admiral for the Alliance to Restore the Republic, commanding the rebel fleet. His exploits during the Clone Wars with the Mon Calamari Guard helped Prince Lee-Char win the planet's throne and defeat a Separatist plot.



PADMÉ AMIDALA

The elected queen and senator from Naboo, Amidala fought desperately against the invading Trade Federation and brought the Jedi into the war. Her secret marriage to Anakin Skywalker ended tragically, as he fell to the dark side. A heartbroken Padmé died shortly after giving birth to Luke and Leia.



WEDGE ANTILLES

The rebel pilot Wedge Antilles had the distinction of helping destroy not one but two Death Stars. He was one of the few survivors of the strike force at the Battle of Yavin and personally blew up the reactor of the second Death Star at Endor. He later flew crucial secret missions for the New Republic.



CAD BANE

The ruthless and deadly Duros bounty hunter was famed for his exploits during the Clone Wars—a daring holocron theft from the Jedi Temple, a prison break on Coruscant, and the kidnap of the Republic's Supreme Chancellor, Palpatine. There was no job he would not take on—for the right price.



BB-8

The faithful companion to Resistance pilot Poe Dameron, BB-8, a spherical astromech droid, was entrusted with the map to Luke Skywalker by his master. After meeting Rey and Finn, he managed to succeed in his mission. BB-8 was a clever and resourceful droid, well aware of his ability to charm.



JAR JAR BINKS

Jar Jar Binks met Qui-Gon Jinn and Obi-Wan Kenobi during the invasion of Naboo and became friends with the Jedi and Queen Amidala, whom he helped rescue. Later, he became a representative for his planet in the Galactic Senate, unwittingly helping Chancellor Palpatine seize absolute power.



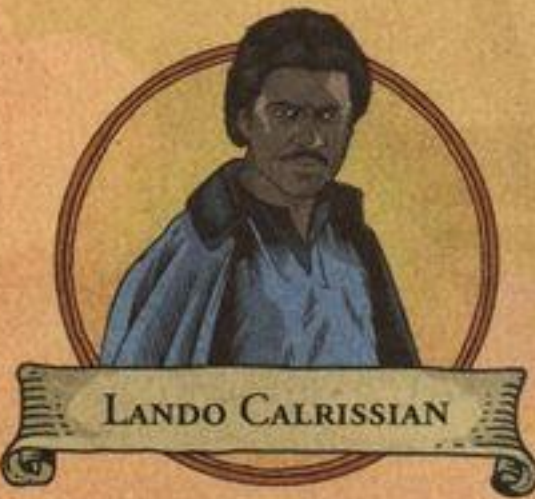
EZRA BRIDGER

With his parents arrested by the Empire for rebellious activities, Ezra grew up on the streets of Lothal's Capital City, stealing to survive. A chance encounter with the former Jedi Kanan Jarrus and his Spectre cell led Ezra to become Jarrus's apprentice and part of the early Rebel Alliance.



C-3PO

A protocol droid built from spare parts by Anakin Skywalker, in his childhood on Tatooine, C-3PO was fluent in over seven million forms of communication. Despite his anxious nature, C-3PO played a pivotal role in the Galactic Civil War, alongside his constant companion and counterpart, R2-D2.



LANDO CALRISSIAN

The roguish gambler Lando Calrissian lost his ship the *Millennium Falcon* to his friend Han Solo in a game of sabacc. Later, as Baron Administrator of Cloud City, he betrayed Solo to the Empire but soon had a change of heart. General Calrissian helped the rebels destroy the second Death Star at the Battle of Endor.



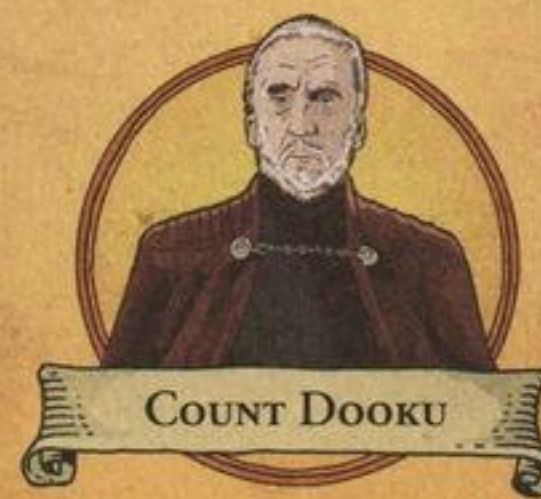
CHEWBACCA

The legendary Wookiee Chewbacca fought for the Republic in the Clone Wars and later gained fame as one of the heroes of the Battle of Yavin. He and his friend Han Solo became key figures in the Rebellion. An ace pilot and engineer, Chewbacca was also a mighty warrior and crack shot with his bowcaster.



POE DAMERON

Poe Dameron was an ace pilot for the Republic who was recruited by General Organa for her Resistance organization. He helped secure the map to the location of Luke Skywalker, despite the First Order's capturing and interrogating him, and fired the shots that destroyed the Starkiller superweapon.



COUNT DOOKU

Dooku trained as the Padawan of Jedi Master Yoda and became a Jedi Master himself. He came to believe the Republic was corrupt and left to raise a Separatist army against it. As the Sith Lord Darth Tyrannus, he was the apprentice of Darth Sidious until his master betrayed him. He was killed by Anakin Skywalker.



BOBA FETT

Boba was a clone of his "father," Jango Fett, and as a boy witnessed his death at the hands of Jedi Master Mace Windu. He grew up to become one of the galaxy's most dangerous bounty hunters. Near the end of the Galactic Civil War, he fell into a sarlacc pit on Tatooine while working for Jabba the Hutt.



JANGO FETT

The galaxy's most feared bounty hunter, Jango Fett was chosen as the genetic template for the Republic's clone troopers as part of a plot by the Sith Lords Chancellor Palpatine and Count Dooku. He fought Obi-Wan Kenobi on Kamino and was killed during the Battle of Geonosis by Jedi Master Mace Windu.



FINN

Raised from infancy to be a stormtrooper for the First Order, FN-2187 was a model soldier until his first combat mission. He refused to fire on innocent people and fled the First Order with the Resistance pilot Poe Dameron, who gave him the name Finn. He then helped his new friends destroy Starkiller base.



GRAND INQUISITOR

Inquisitors were dark side-using Jedi hunters, employed by Emperor Palpatine to seek out survivors of Order 66. The Grand Inquisitor was sent to the planet Lothal to find Kanan Jarrus, but after a series of battles, Jarrus defeated him in a duel aboard the Star Destroyer *Sovereign*, and the Grand Inquisitor was destroyed.



GENERAL GRIEVOUS

The Kaleesh warrior Grievous was a fearsome cyborg, with almost all of his original body replaced by mechanical "upgrades." Trained in lightsaber combat by Count Dooku, Grievous became a key Separatist general, commanding vast droid armies. He was killed by Obi-Wan Kenobi near the end of the Clone Wars.



JABBA THE HUTT

The vile gangster ruled a criminal empire from his palace on Tatooine. After a bounty hunter brought him Han Solo, the Hutt's former employee, Jabba hung Han frozen in carbonite on the wall of his throne room. When Luke Skywalker rescued Han, Princess Leia slayed the Hutt.



KANAN JARRUS

Caleb Dume was only a Padawan learner when Order 66 happened, and his master Depa Billaba was killed helping him escape. Taking the name Kanan Jarrus, he fled his old life, until events forced him to take up his lightsaber once more. His rebel cell became a serious threat to the Empire.



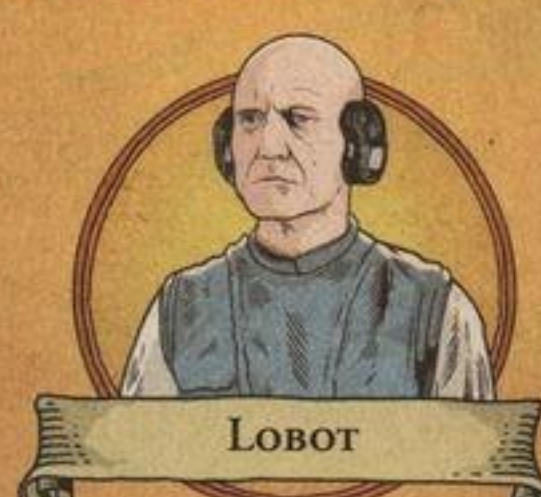
QUI-GON JINN

A powerful and unusual Jedi Master, Qui-Gon Jinn was trained by Count Dooku and in turn was the master of Obi-Wan Kenobi. He learned the secret of maintaining his consciousness after death, a power he passed on to Yoda and Kenobi. Jinn was slain by the Sith Darth Maul during the invasion of Naboo.



OBI-WAN KENOBI

Famed as a wise negotiator and cunning warrior, Obi-Wan Kenobi fought with intelligence and courage in the Clone Wars. With the rise of the Empire, he took it upon himself to watch over Luke Skywalker and trained him as a Jedi. He sacrificed himself against Darth Vader to save Luke, but his spirit lived on.



LOBOT

Lobot had cybernetic implants put into his brain by the Empire, enabling him to run complex calculations for them. While helping Lando steal Emperor Palpatine's yacht, he was seriously injured and his cyborg brain took over. Later, he helped the crew of the *Millennium Falcon* escape Cloud City.



DARTH MAUL

Maul, a Zabrak from Dathomir, was born to Talzin of the Nightsisters but kidnapped by Darth Sidious as a child. Through years of cruel training, he became a devastating Sith warrior and slew the Jedi Master Qui-Gon Jinn. He was then maimed by Obi-Wan Kenobi, only to rise again as a cyborg crime lord.



MON MOTHMA

Mon Mothma was senator for the planet Chandrila during the Clone Wars, but as Supreme Chancellor Palpatine tightened his grip on the Republic, she began to form a network of resistance. She became a key leader in the Alliance to Restore the Republic and later served as the first chancellor of the New Republic.



HONDO OHNAKA

Hondo was a cunning Weequay pirate and leader of the Ohnaka Gang, operating from the Outer Rim planet Florrum. They engaged in kidnapping for ransom, robbery, black-market arms trading, and extortion. A born survivor, he lived through clashes with the Jedi, the Separatists, and Darth Maul.



SAVAGE OPRESS

Savage was a Nightbrother warrior who was infused with dark magicks by his mother, Talzin, and transformed into a monstrous warrior. He learned the dark side as an apprentice under Count Dooku and, later, his brother Maul. The brothers duelled Darth Sidious, who defeated them and slew Opress.



ZEB ORRELIOS

The Empire brutally massacred the Lasat people, from the Outer Rim world Lasan. One of the few survivors was Garazeb Orrelios, a member of the Lasan Honor Guard. A formidable warrior, the gruff but good-hearted Orrelios became a member of a rebel cell that came together on Lothal.



LEIA ORGANA

Leia was raised as a princess by her adoptive parents on Alderaan and grew up to become both a senator and a rebel leader. Her real father, Darth Vader, never knew the truth. After winning the Galactic Civil War, Leia married Han Solo and led the Resistance against the sinister First Order.



PALPATINE

Born on Naboo, Sheev Palpatine became a senator and, through clever political scheming, Supreme Chancellor. Secretly, he was Sidious, Dark Lord of the Sith, controlling both sides in the Clone Wars and seizing absolute power as Emperor. He was destroyed by his former pupil Anakin Skywalker.



CAPTAIN PHASMA

Alongside General Hux and Kylo Ren, Captain Phasma was one of the key commanders of the First Order. She was in charge of training stormtroopers and led them into battle herself. Her distinctive armor was coated with chromium salvaged from a starship once owned by Emperor Palpatine.



R2-D2

Heroic astromech droid R2-D2 witnessed some of the galaxy's most crucial events, from the invasion of Naboo and the Clone Wars to the rise and fall of the Galactic Empire. He accompanied both Anakin and Luke Skywalker on adventures and was key in efforts to destroy the Death Star.



KYLO REN

At his birth, the son of Han Solo and Leia Organa was named Ben. His Jedi training with Luke Skywalker ended in tragedy when, seduced by the dark side, he betrayed the other students and became responsible for their destruction. As Kylo Ren, the First Order's enforcer, he killed his father on Starkiller base.



REY

Rey grew up on the planet Jakku, where she had been left at an early age. She scavenged the ship graveyard for parts to trade to her guardian, the junkboss Unkar Plutt, and waited for her family. A chance encounter with a Resistance droid led her to leave the planet and discover her destiny as a Jedi.



ANAKIN SKYWALKER

Anakin Skywalker was discovered as a child slave on the planet Tatooine by the Jedi Master Qui-Gon Jinn. His incredible potential led to his being trained as a Jedi, and he became one of the Republic's greatest heroes. However, he came under the sway of the Sith Lord Darth Sidious and fell to the dark side.



LUKE SKYWALKER

The farm boy from Tatooine who longed for the stars became one of the galaxy's most important figures. The last Jedi Knight trained by Obi-Wan Kenobi and Yoda, he joined the Rebel Alliance; turned his father, Anakin Skywalker, back to the light; and overthrew the Emperor. Later, he withdrew from galactic affairs.



HAN SOLO

A smuggler, rogue, famed pilot, and crack shot, Han Solo became caught up in the Galactic Civil War when he was hired to take Obi-Wan Kenobi and Luke Skywalker to Alderaan. He joined the rebels, helped win the war, and married Princess Leia, but was later tragically struck down by his son, Ben.



HERA SYNDULLA

The daughter of famed Twi'lek freedom fighter, Cham Syndulla, Hera grew up on her home planet Ryloth as the Clone Wars and Imperial occupation ravaged it. Hera decided to leave Ryloth in her ship, the *Ghost*, to fight the Empire and became a founding member of a rebel cell based on Lothal.



MOTHER TALZIN

The leader of Dathomir's Nightsisters, Mother Talzin was a powerful sorceress who wielded the dark side of the Force. She plotted both with and against the Sith Lords Sidious and Tyranus, who eventually sent Grievous to destroy her clan. She was killed saving her son, Darth Maul, from Palpatine and Dooku.



AHSOKA TANO

Grand Master Yoda assigned this young but talented Togruta Jedi to Anakin Skywalker as his Padawan learner. She served heroically in the Clone Wars before a sinister plot led her to leave the Order. Later, as the agent Fulcrum, she helped establish a network of rebels against Imperial tyranny.



WILHUFF TARKIN

Ruthlessly ambitious and highly intelligent, Wilhuff Tarkin rose through the ranks of the Imperial military to become one of the most powerful men in the galaxy. As Grand Moff, he commanded the first Death Star, destroying the planet Alderaan. He was killed when the battle station exploded.



LOR SAN TEKKA

Lor San Tekka was an explorer who was fascinated by the legends of the Jedi and became a member of the Church of the Force, which kept Jedi ideals alive in the age of the Empire. He possessed a map that could help locate Luke Skywalker and gave it to the Resistance before Kylo Ren struck him down.



SHAAK TI

The Togruta Jedi Master Shaak Ti was a member of the High Council during the Clone Wars and was responsible for the training of the Republic's clone army on the planet Kamino. Though a skilled and cunning warrior, she was killed by Darth Vader during the Jedi Purge as she meditated in the Temple.



LUMINARA UNDULI

A member of the Jedi High Council, Luminara Unduli was one of the most highly respected Jedi Masters of her time. Following the victory of Emperor Palpatine over the Jedi, Unduli was executed on Stygeon Prime and her image was used as a trap to draw in survivors of Order 66.



DARTH VADER

When Anakin Skywalker turned to the dark side, his new master dubbed him Darth Vader. Terribly injured on Mustafar, he was sealed into cyborg life-support armor and served the Emperor as his feared right hand. Later, he turned on his master, destroying him to save the life of his son, Luke Skywalker.



ASAJJ VENTRESS

Born on Dathomir into the Force-using clan of Nightsisters, Ventress was apprenticed to the Sith Lord Count Dooku and became his assassin. Dooku and Ventress eventually tried to kill each other, and she struck out on her own as a bounty hunter. She died heroically, protecting the Jedi Quinlan Vos.



MACE WINDU

Jedi Master Mace Windu was known as one of the Order's greatest champions. His skill with a lightsaber and the Force was almost unmatched. He fought many key battles of the Clone Wars, including the raid on Geonosis, as a general. He was killed by Darth Sidious while trying to arrest the Sith Lord.



SABINE WREN

Sabine Wren was born into the Mandalorian warrior tradition. As a child, she joined the Imperial Academy as a cadet. However, the Empire's oppression led her to flee her home planet and join a cell of rebels on the planet Lothal. She was a weapons and explosives expert and a keen artist.



YODA

The Grand Master of the Jedi Council was the wisest and most powerful of them all. However, he failed to uncover the Sith Lord Sidious and arrogantly chose to face him in single combat. After Palpatine fought him to a standstill, Yoda retreated into exile, where he eventually trained Luke Skywalker.

ABAFAR TO YAVIN 4

ABAFAR: A barren world rich in rhydonium. During the Clone Wars, the Separatists loaded a stolen freighter with this explosive and tried to use it to blow up a top Republic military conference. They were thwarted by D-Squad, a covert team of droids led by Colonel Meebur Gascon.

DANTOOINE: Once used by the Rebel Alliance as a base, it was the location given by Princess Leia to Grand Moff Tarkin when he demanded she reveal the rebel headquarters. Because Dantooine was too remote to demonstrate the Death Star's power, Tarkin targeted her home planet of Alderaan instead.

DATHOMIR: A mysterious world of jungles, swamps, and mountains, haunted by witches and rancors. Dathomir's Nightsisters were one of the known groups of Force-users who were neither Jedi nor Sith until conflict with Darth Tyrannus and Darth Sidious led to one of their clans being massacred.



MON CALA: The vast oceans of Mon Cala are home to the Mon Calamari and Quarren species. A bitter struggle between the two led to the groups' taking opposite sides during the Clone Wars. The Republic defeated the Separatists, and Lee-Char of the Mon Calamari proved himself in battle, becoming king.

The planet suffered under the Empire, and the Mon Calamari became key allies of the rebels. Admiral Ackbar was commander of the rebel fleet at the Battle of Endor.

Mon Calamari ships were some of the largest and most powerful in the rebel fleet.

MORABAND: The desolate homeworld of the Sith holds many evil secrets. In the Valley of the Dark Lords, the tombs of powerful Sith are haunted by the presence of the dark side. Yoda traveled here as part of his quest to discover the secret of immortality and encountered a vision of Darth Bane.

MORTIS: Discovered by the Jedi Anakin Skywalker, Mortis is a mysterious realm resembling a bizarre planet whose landscape changes constantly. It was home to three powerful Force wielders, the Daughter, the Son, and the Father, who represented the light, the dark, and balance, respectively.

QUERMIA: Home to the Quermian species—tall, pale humanoids with long necks and two pairs of arms.

Quermian Jedi Master Yrael Poof was a respected member of the Jedi Council, known for his skill with diplomacy, illusions, and mind tricks.

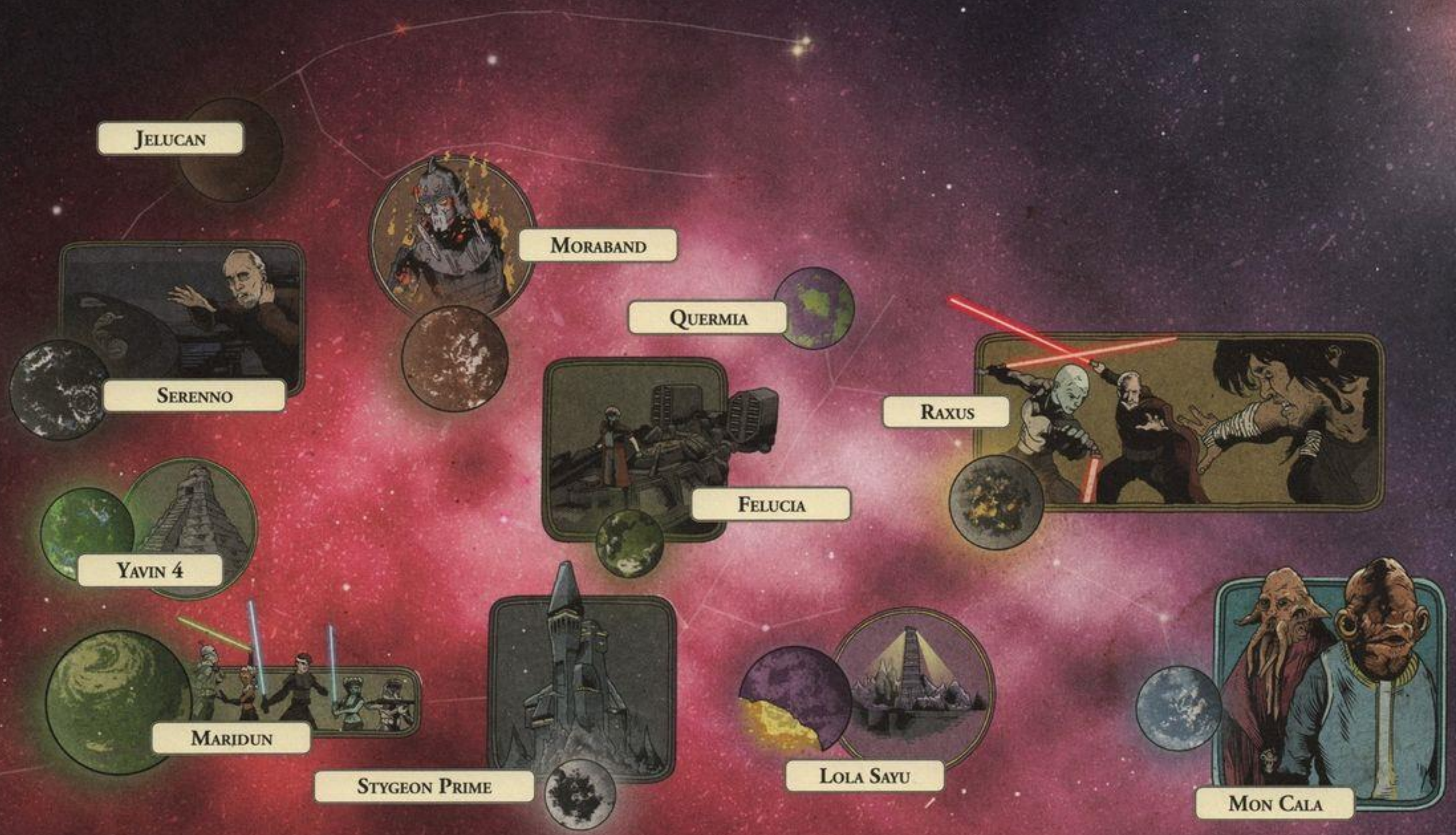
FELUCIA: Felucia's position in the middle of an important hyperspace lane made it a key target during the Clone Wars. Many battles were fought for control of it. The planet itself is a farm world with great jungles of fungus. It is noted for its production of the valuable healing herb nysillin.

ITHOR: The peaceful Ithorian people, sometimes known as "hammerheads," tend to the sacred jungles of their homeworlds. They are known for their remarkable farming technology. The Galactic Empire forced them to reveal their secrets in return for sparing the planet a devastating invasion.

JELUCAN: A world of ice and towering mountain peaks. Jelucan was settled in two waves of colonists—the second-wavers became rich miners while the first-wavers clung to their more rigid mountain traditions. It is notable as the homeworld of star-crossed lovers Thane Kyrell and Ciena Ree.

LOLA SAYU: From orbit, Lola Sayu is a purple jewel of a planet. It is volcanic, with a cracked surface through which lakes of lava bubble up. It was once the site of a Jedi prison called the Citadel. When the Separatists took over the planet, they used it to hold Jedi prisoners of their own.

MARIDUN: A grass-covered planet, home to the peace-loving Lurmen. It was used to test a new Separatist weapon, the Defoliator, which destroyed life but not technology—like the Separatists' battle droids. The scheme was foiled by the Jedi Anakin Skywalker, Ahsoka Tano, and Aayla Secura.



RAXUS: The capital of the Confederacy of Independent Systems during the Clone Wars, Raxus is a beautiful world of forests, plains, and oceans.

From here, Count Dooku sparked the Separatist Crisis that led to the Clone Wars and the fall of the Republic.

SCIPPIO: The InterGalactic Banking Clan, one of the most important organizations in the Outer Rim, was based on the icy planet Scipio. During the Clone Wars, this key Separatist planet was captured by the Republic, giving Chancellor Palpatine control of the galaxy's largest banking system.

SERENNO: A forested world that was home to Count Dooku, one of the central figures of the Clone Wars. An aristocrat who gave up his title to join the Jedi Order, he later became disillusioned and left to form the Separatists. He was also, secretly, Darth Tyrannus, apprentice to Darth Sidious.

STYGEON PRIME: The snow-capped mountains of Stygeon Prime hid the high-security prison known as the Spire. Darth Sidious imprisoned his former apprentice Darth Maul here. He also kept the remains of Jedi Master Luminara Unduli here to lure in any Jedi who survived the Order's destruction.

YAVIN 4: The small jungle moon that served as a base for the Rebel Alliance for its assault on the first Death Star.

This rebel base location was the crucial secret held back by the rebel leader and senator Leia Organa during her interrogation by Darth Vader.

DATHOMIR

A remote world lit by a dim red star, Dathomir's jungles, forests, and swamplands were home to the Nightsisters—a clan of Force-using witches—and the Zabrak Nightbrothers, famed for their fighting prowess.

The planet is infamous as the home of the warriors Asajj Ventress and Darth Maul, who were both trained in the ways of the dark side before turning away from the Sith.



19 847: Nightbrother Prospects

19 847: Asajj Ventress joins the Nightbrother warriors, looking for a new mission for her master, Count Dooku.

NIGHTBROTHER VILLAGE

The Nightbrothers live in a harsh, mountainous part of the planet and are renowned for their toughness.



19 847: To prove his loyalty to the Nightsisters, Savage Opress kills his brother Feril.



19 847: Savage Opress

19 847: Maul leads the Shadow Collective, a sinister alliance of crime syndicates, to get revenge on his one-time master, Darth Sidious. They clash with the Separatists on Dathomir. Grievous's deeds are penal against the Nightbrothers and Darth Maul's Mandalorian allies, Death Watch.



19 847: As the battle rages, Mother Talzin uses her magic against Count Dooku and Darth Sidious. Despite her own dark powers, she cannot defeat the Sith Lords.



19 847: Mother Talzin buys time for Maul to escape—at the cost of her life. She is cut down by Grievous.



Nightsister assassin Asajj Ventress learned her deadly trade on Dathomir. When her master Count Dooku betrays her, she returns to her homeworld, looking for revenge.

Distinctive triangular speeders are used on Dathomir.



SWAMPS

Darth Sidious travels to Dathomir to share his knowledge of the dark side with Mother Talzin, leader of the Nightsisters. He takes her son Maul and raises him as his apprentice.

19 847: When the Nightsisters attempt to kill Count Dooku, he sends Grievous and his droids to destroy them.

19 847: Despite her army of undead, General Grievous slays Old Daka and his troops take the Nightsister village. Only Talzin and Ventress escape.



19 847: Maul's brother Savage Opress is infused with dark magic and becomes a mighty and terrifying warrior. He will become Dooku's new assassin, but Talzin plans to use him against the Count.



19 847: Obi-Wan and Anakin arrive to investigate the "monsters," Savage Opress, who is killing Jedi.

Hags, terrifying semi-intelligent rancors are native to Dathomir.



32 847: Years after his supposed death, Darth Maul returns to Dathomir. Talzin replaces his broken cyborg spider legs with more humanoid ones.





Elegant whisper birds roost in Yavin's swamps.



YAVIN 4

The forested fourth moon of the red gas giant Yavin is known for its mysterious monuments and great stepped temples, which sheltered the forces of the Alliance to Restore the Republic during the early days of the Galactic Civil War. The moon—and the hopes of the Rebellion—would have been annihilated if not for the destruction of the Death Star.



Ahsoka Tano is tasked with a crucial mission by the Rebel Alliance—to steal the plans of the Empire's secret weapon, the Death Star.



Vast leviathan groves burrow for years beneath the moon's dense forests, feeding on tree roots.



Rebel pilots Key Dameron and Shara Bey settle here in the aftermath of the Galactic Civil War. They plant a Force-sensitive relic, one of the last such relics in the galaxy.

Brightly colored woodlanders live in the forest canopy.



Plant-eating ruminants forage on the forest floor. They are often harassed by piranha beetles.



PIRANHA BEETLE
Carnivorous piranha beetles can be deadly in large swarms.

Sinivulle are a species of rodent that burrow in packs. They are known to prey on whisper birds.



The heroes of the Battle of Yavin are honored in a ceremony at the headquarters of the Rebel Alliance.



Bullous anglers dangle their limbs in the swamps, waiting for food to absorb.



Armored eels lurk in the swamps, fishing for lizard crabs.



Lizard crabs are native to Yavin 4's swamps, and many creatures prey upon them.





JON "DUTCH" VANDER

The vulnerability revealed by the Death Star plans is a small thermal exhaust port, only two meters wide, located in the meridian trench near the southern pole of the station. Jon "Dutch" Vander and Garven Dries make attack runs with Gold and Red Squadrons, but neither succeeds.



LUKE SKYWALKER

Luke Skywalker uses the Force and fires his proton torpedoes directly into the thermal exhaust port.



WEDGE ANTILLES

With Darth Vader wreaking havoc on the rebel starfighters, Luke Skywalker must make the final trench run. With his wingman, Wedge Antilles, forced to break off his attack, Luke honors the spirit of his master Obi-Wan Kenobi as he uses the target.

BATTLE OF YAVIN

In an attempt to discover the location of the rebel base and to destroy the Rebellion forever, Grand Moff Tarkin and Darth Vader allow Princess Leia to be rescued from the Death Star by the crew of the *Millennium Falcon*. The Empire tracks the freighter to Yavin 4, where the rebels have one small chance to destroy the battle station before it is able to fire on them.

Fast, maneuverable X-wings are able to evade the Death Star's turbolasers.



Grand Moff Tarkin refuses to believe that his battle station is under threat and remains on board during the attack.



With Darth Vader about to destroy Luke Skywalker's X-wing, the *Millennium Falcon* manages to save the rebel pilot.



After the battle, Imperial pilot Ciena Ree is sent to rescue Darth Vader. She is shocked by the destruction of the Death Star and the deaths of many friends.

During the Imperial era, the planet suffered under occupation and began to provide secret support to the Alliance to Restore the Republic in the form of ships, as well as soldiers like Admiral Ackbar.

The Jedi Council sends clone troops and Jedi, including Anakin Skywalker and Ahsoka Tano, to help against the Separatists.



With the tide of battle turning in favor of the Separatists, the Republic calls in a squad of Geonings from Naboo.

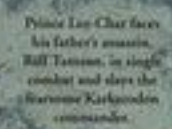

ALDERAAN TO TETH

ALDERAAN: Known for its stunning natural beauty, Alderaan was one of the oldest members of the Galactic Republic, a peaceful world whose people valued art and culture. Because of its leaders' secret support for the Rebel Alliance, it was destroyed by the Empire using the Death Star.

ANTAR 4: Scene of the infamous Antar Atrocity, carried out by Grand Moff Tarkin as a warning to former Separatists.

BALNAB: A primitive world once visited by C-3PO and R2-D2. The planet's ruler is a hologram created by a group of stranded pit droids.

CORELLIA: An important Core world known for its ships and pilots. Han Solo and Wedge Antilles were born here, and the Corellian Engineering Corporation manufactured the YT-1300 light freighter the *Millennium Falcon*, known as one of the fastest ships in the galaxy.

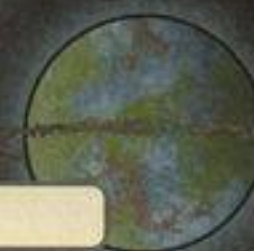

LOTHAL: A quiet and peaceful agricultural world known for its jogan fruit. At first, Lothal welcomed the Galactic Empire. However, the Empire soon began to oppress and exploit Lothal, strip-mining it for minerals. A famous cell of rebels formed here and won notable victories against the Empire.

MANDALORE: The Mandalorian people were once renowned as fierce and deadly warriors. However, the New Mandalorians have tried to put the violence of the past behind them. They are opposed by terrorists like Death Watch, operating from their exile on Mandalore's moon, Concordia.

ONDERON: Onderon's thick jungles are inhabited by deadly creatures. The humans on this planet live in cities protected by thick walls, such as the capital city, Iziz. A key rebel leader, Saw Gerra, waged a guerrilla campaign here against the occupying Separatist forces with the help of the Jedi.

ORD MANTELL: A mountainous world covered by thick, pinkish clouds and inhabited by Falleen and humans, Ord Mantell is well known as a base of the Black Sun gang. During the Clone Wars, Maul's Shadow Collective took over the Black Sun and fought a battle here against the Separatists.

CORUSCANT: Capital of the Republic and, later, the Galactic Empire. It is a planet covered by a vast city of skyscrapers, rising miles into the sky.

After the Galactic Civil War, the Galactic Senate of the New Republic moved from system to system on a rotating basis.

GAREL: Briefly the hiding place of the rebel cell led by Hera Syndulla and Kanan Jarrus, during the Imperial years.

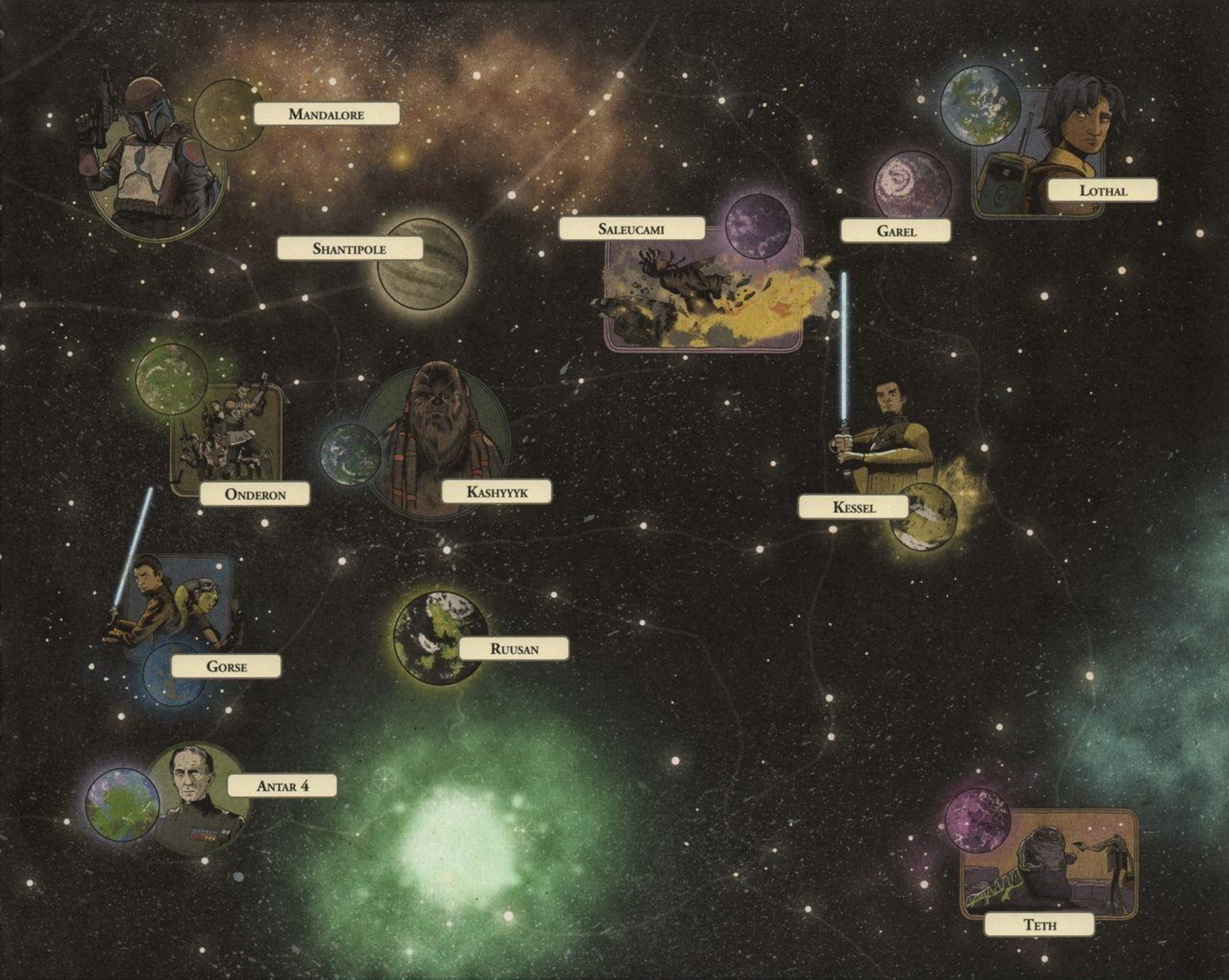
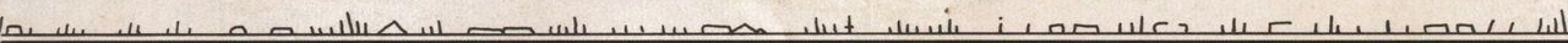
GORSE: A mining world, with one side permanently in darkness and the other in blazing sunlight. Kanan Jarrus met Hera Syndulla here.

HOSNIAN PRIME: With the Empire defeated, a New Republic rose from the ashes. Its capital was changed by election every few years. While the Senate was based on Hosnian Prime, the First Order used Starkiller base to destroy the system, the Senate, and much of the Republic's fleet.

JEDHA: An ancient world, Jedha was once a place of holy pilgrimage. During Imperial occupation, extremist rebel Saw Gerrera had a hideout here.

KASHYYYK: The Wookiee homeworld, known for its majestic wroshyr trees. Cities spiral around their huge trunks.

KESSEL: One side of this world is lush and beautiful. Elegant palaces and their exquisitely tended grounds sit among green forests and crystal lakes. On the other side of the world, vast colonies of slaves labor in the infamous spice mines. Spice smugglers can make vast profits on the "Kessel Run."



RUUSAN: During the Clone Wars, one of Ruusan's three moons hid a Separatist base, Skytop Station, eavesdropping on Republic transmissions. General Grievous took the captured R2-D2 here to unlock the Republic's secrets in his databanks. The droid was rescued by Anakin Skywalker.

SALEUCAMI: Many people who wished to escape the chaos of the Clone Wars settled on remote Saleucami, including clone trooper Cut Lawquane, who deserted to raise a family. Eventually, war did reach the planet as the Republic and the Separatists clashed in one of the final battles of the conflict.

SHANTIPOLE: Lightning storms rage among the mountain peaks of Shantipole, and the atmosphere is highly dangerous for piloting starships. Here, away from the watchful gaze of the Empire, the Mon Calamari engineer Quarrie invented the prototype Blade Wing—or B-wing fighter—for the rebels.

SHILI: The homeworld of the Togruta, who are instantly recognizable thanks to their brightly patterned skin, head-tails, and montrals—hollow, cone-shaped horns that allow the Togruta to track movement. Two famous Jedi were from Shili—Jedi Master Shaak Ti and the Padawan Ahsoka Tano.

TETH: A mountainous jungle planet in a Hutt-controlled area of Wild Space. Teth was once inhabited by the bizarre monks of the B'omarr Order, whose brains were transplanted into spider-like droid bodies. It was the scene of the daring rescue of the infant Rotta the Hutt by Anakin Skywalker.

LOTHAL

A once tranquil agricultural world known for its jogan fruit, Lothal suffered under the Galactic Empire, which ruthlessly strip-mined the planet for ores and crystals to fuel military production. It was on Lothal that the rebel cell founded by Kanan Jarrus and Hera Syndulla came together and won a series of notable victories against Imperial forces.



1 800: Ezra Bridger, an orphan, lives in an abandoned communications tower. He collects Imperial helmets, including that of a TIE fighter pilot who attacked him.

6 800: Zee Leonis and Mero Spanfil, schoolmates at AppSci, begin to investigate the Empire's activities.

Loth-cats are a feline species native to Lothal. They stalk the grasslands, hunting their main prey—the Loth-vee.

7 800: Ezra Bridger infiltrates the Imperial Academy on Lothal, where he meets Zee Leonis, who also has a rebellious hidden agenda.

8 800: Hera Syndulla knocks out Senator Gall Trayvis, whom she has discovered is posing as a rebel sympathizer to lure them into a trap.



4 800: The Lothal rebels take over a radio tower and broadcast a stirring message of resistance against the Empire.

1 800: Ezra Bridger joins the crew of the Ghost.

4 800: The Lothal rebels manage to destroy a new prototype TIE fighter on Empire Day.

4 800: Kanan Jarrus takes his apprentice, Ezra Bridger, to the old Jedi Temple on Lothal. Here, Ezra is tested and communicates with Master Yoda.

1 800: Old Jho's Pie Shop, a cantina in the small settlement of Jhothal, is an outpost friendly to the rebels.

1 800: Pursued by Kanan Jarrus, Ezra Bridger flees with stolen Imperial cargo.

1 800: Ezra Bridger and Garazeb Ordelean are sent out for fruit but end up stealing a TIE fighter.

4 800: Darth Vader proves more than a match for Kanan Jarrus and Ezra Bridger.

14 800: Ephraim and Mira Bridger start to make underground radio broadcasts against Imperial rule—the Bridger Transmissions.



4 800: With the fall of the Grand Inquisitor, the Emperor sends a replacement to Lothal to root out the rebel cell—the Dark Lord of the Sith, Darth Vader.

4 800: Zee Leonis loses an arm to the legendary gambler Lando Calrissian.



STARKILLER BASE

The First Order's ultimate weapon, even more fearsome than the Death Star, is constructed from an entire planet. It fires a beam of phantom energy through hyperspace and is capable of destroying entire star systems. Recharging the weapon requires that the power of a sun be completely drained.



Planetary shields prevent ships from landing—unless they are traveling at lightspeed. Han Solo and Chewbacca bring the Millennium Falcon out of hyperspace beneath the shield, an incredibly dangerous and skillful maneuver.



Kylo Ren attempts to seduce and turn Rey to the dark side. However, she fights back, using the Force instinctively.



Kylo Ren, shot and wounded by Chewbacca, pursues Rey and Finn outside the base. He duels Finn and seriously wounds him before Rey recovers a lightsaber and attacks him furiously. The Knight of Ren is defeated. As the Starkiller weapon is destroyed and the planet begins to crumble, Rey is rescued by Chewbacca in the Falcon.



Rey and Finn escape from Starkiller base in a stolen First Order snowspeeder, pursued by starfighters. They are able to fight off their attackers.



General Hux rallies the troops of the First Order as he prepares to fire the Starkiller weapon for the first time. The powerful beam destroys five key Republic star systems and much of its navy.



New reunited with Rey, Han Solo, Finn, and Chewbacca plan to plant explosives to expose the crucial oscillator. With this destroyed, the weapon will overload, blowing up the entire base.



Finn, who was once stationed on the base, helps Han Solo and Chewbacca sneak inside. He plans to locate Rey.



With the planetary shield brought down, Poe Dameron's fighter squadrons arrive to attack the oscillator.



Finn, Han Solo, and Chewbacca make their way inside and capture Captain Phasma. They force her to lower the base's shields.



Kylo Ren fully embraces the dark side, murdering his father, Han Solo.

Rey escapes from her cell by using a Jedi mind trick and looks for a way off the planet. By luck, she finds Finn, Han Solo, and Chewbacca infiltrating the base.



The mysterious Supreme Leader Snoke prefers to talk to his underlings using a giant hologram in his fearsome throne room. It is here that he orders Hux to use the Starkiller base against the Republic.



CORUSCANT

Coruscant's surface is one colossal city, with skytowers reaching thousands of stories into the air. It was also the seat of government for the Old Republic and, later, the Galactic Empire. Representatives from thousands of worlds met to debate in the Senate—until the Emperor dissolved it and took absolute power for himself. After the fall of the Empire, the New Republic's government moved from system to system, until 34 ABY, when it was destroyed in the Hosnian system by the First Order.



The vast Galactic Senate Building dominates the Senate District. The chamber held 1,024 delegations from the worlds of the Republic.

32 BBY: Obi-Wan Kenobi hitches a ride on the assassin's ASN-121 courier droid.

32 BBY: A series of attempts are made on the life of Senator Padmé Amidala. Venomous knobots are smuggled into her apartment by an assassin while she sleeps.

19 BBY: Chancellor Palpatine is revealed as the Sith Lord Darth Sidious, and Jedi Masters Mace Windu, Sateé Tiin, Agen Kolar, and Kit Fisto attempt to arrest him in his office. Sidious destroys them.

19 BBY: Anakin Skywalker falls to the dark side and is dubbed Darth Vader by his new master, Darth Sidious. For his first task, Vader leads the clone troopers of the 501st Legion to the Jedi Temple, where they slaughter the Jedi.

12 BBY: The child Anakin Skywalker is brought before the Jedi Council. Despite their misgivings, they agree that he may be trained.

15 BBY: The Jedi Temple has stood for millennia and seen generations of Padawan learners train in the ways of the Force. It endured until the Jedi Purge. Afterward, it became the palace of the Emperor.

12 BBY: Yoda trains younglings in the Jedi Temple. Low-power training lightsabers are provided, to minimize the risk of injury.

33 BBY: Anakin Skywalker commandeers a speeder, and the two Jedi chase the assassin through the city.

19 BBY: Anakin Skywalker and Chancellor Palpatine attend the Galactic Opera House performance of *Squid Lake*.

12 BBY: The Jedi track Padmé's would-be assassin to the Outlander Club, where a Baloo criminal attempts to sell Obi-Wan death-ricks.

12 BBY: The giant and terrifying Zillo Bees, brought to Coruscant from the planet Malastare for research, rampages through the capital.

Dexter Jettster runs a diner in the run-down industrial district, CoCo Town.

12 BBY: The assassin, a shape-shifting Chewbacca called Zam Wesell, is cornered—but then assassinated by her employer Jango Fett.

KASHYYYK

A lush forest planet that is home to the mighty Wookiee species. The Wookiees live in settlements built into the giant wroshyr trees, whose wood is also incorporated into much Wookiee technology. The Wookiees are known for their great physical strength and aptitude for engineering. During the rule of Emperor Palpatine, the species was used as slave labor.

ca 1000: Master Yoda is sent to Kashyyyk with a battalion of clone troopers to reinforce the Wookiees in their battle against Separatist forces.

ca 1000: Separatist troops target the Kashyyyk oil refinery in an attempt to cut off fuel supplies.

The famous *Kashyyyk* *Gunship* manufactured by Apptannan Engineering Works, sees action during the Clone Wars.

Wookiees are enslaved by the Empire and sent to work on planets like Kessel. A Wookiee revolt is put down by General Kaddak.

ca 1000: Order 66 is issued, but Master Yoda senses the danger and slays the troopers who try to assassinate him.

ca 1000: Separatist troops rush across the lagoon to the capital city, Kashyyyk. They are met on the beaches by a Wookiee army and the Republic's clone troops, who manage to defeat the enemy.

Overseer *transportation* style gunships, built by Apptannan Engineering, are crewed by one pilot and three gunners.

The signature weapon of the Wookiee warrior is the bowcaster.

Kashyyyk is one of several planets where the insects called *con-artils* can be found.



MANDALORE

A once beautiful world scarred by centuries of war. Endless battles have turned it into a vast desert studded with domed cities. The feared Mandalorian warriors were exiled to the moon of Concordia while the New Mandalorians attempted to rebuild their world in peace. During the Clone Wars, the New Mandalorian ruler, Duchess Satine Kryze, was overthrown by the terrorist group Death Watch, despite the efforts of her old friend Obi-Wan Kenobi.

MANDALORIAN WARRIORS

Mandalorians are some of the galaxy's most feared warriors. Their distinctive armor contains an arsenal of deadly weapons, and they are skilled in the use of personal rocket packs. The bounty hunter Jango and Boba Fett favored Mandalorian armor.



Duchess Satine Kryze leads the New Mandalorian Government.



The Peace Park is a memorial to the victims of Mandalore's violent past.

20 881: Morgan smugglers, who have been caught selling contaminated tea, skirmish with Mandalorian security forces as Duchess Satine struggles with corruption.

20 881: Cadets Ania, Korkie, Lagon, and Sotice discover that Prime Minister Almec is tied to the black market on Mandalore.



19 881: Ziroh Moj of Death Maul's Shadow Collective attacks innocent Mandalorians as part of the group's plan to take over the planet.



Sabine Wren and her friend Ketoo Chyyo attend the Imperial Academy together before deciding to become bounty hunters.



19 881: Duchess Satine is captured by Death Maul and dies in Obi-Wan Kenobi's arms.

19 881: Duchess Satine attempts to escape the Death Watch in a speeder but is captured and imprisoned.



19 881: Darth Maul installs the disgraced former prime minister Almec as the puppet leader of Mandalore.



PRIME MINISTER ALMEC

10 881: Dr. Zak Zai ponders the poisoning of hundreds of schoolchildren. He discovers that the cause is contaminated tea sold by smugglers who are linked to Prime Minister Almec.



19 881: Darth Sidious travels to Mandalore to put an end to Maul's dangerous criminal organization, the Shadow Collective. He defeats both Darth Maul and his brother Savage Opress in an epic duel. He executes Savage but allows Darth Maul to live.



19 881: Pto Vinda, leader of the Mandalorian terrorist group Death Watch, duels Darth Maul using the ancient darkaber, but the Sith Lord destroys him.



JEDHA

Jedha is a place of pilgrimage, the home of a great temple held sacred by those who follow the teachings of the Church of the Force. During the age of the Galactic Empire, it is under Imperial occupation, where scientific teams mine and study kyber crystals.



Extremist rebel Saw Gerrera has spent his life fighting against the Separatists and, later, the Empire using guerrilla warfare. Motivated by the Rebel Alliance, he believes violence is the only way to achieve victory. His hidden base on Jedha was once used to store the skeletal remains of the dead.

A blind warrior monk and disciplined fighter, Chirrut is attuned to the mystical energy of the Force.



Well-armed Baze is always battle-ready. He and Chirrut are inseparable friends.

Saw Gerrera's Akkamar is concealed beneath the ancient ruins.

An Imperial Star Destroyer hovers ominously close to the planet's surface.

The Holy City, like many settlements on Jedha, sits atop a natural mesa.

TEMPLE OF THE WHILLS

Pilgrims on Jedha can be recognized by their distinctive, often unusual robes.

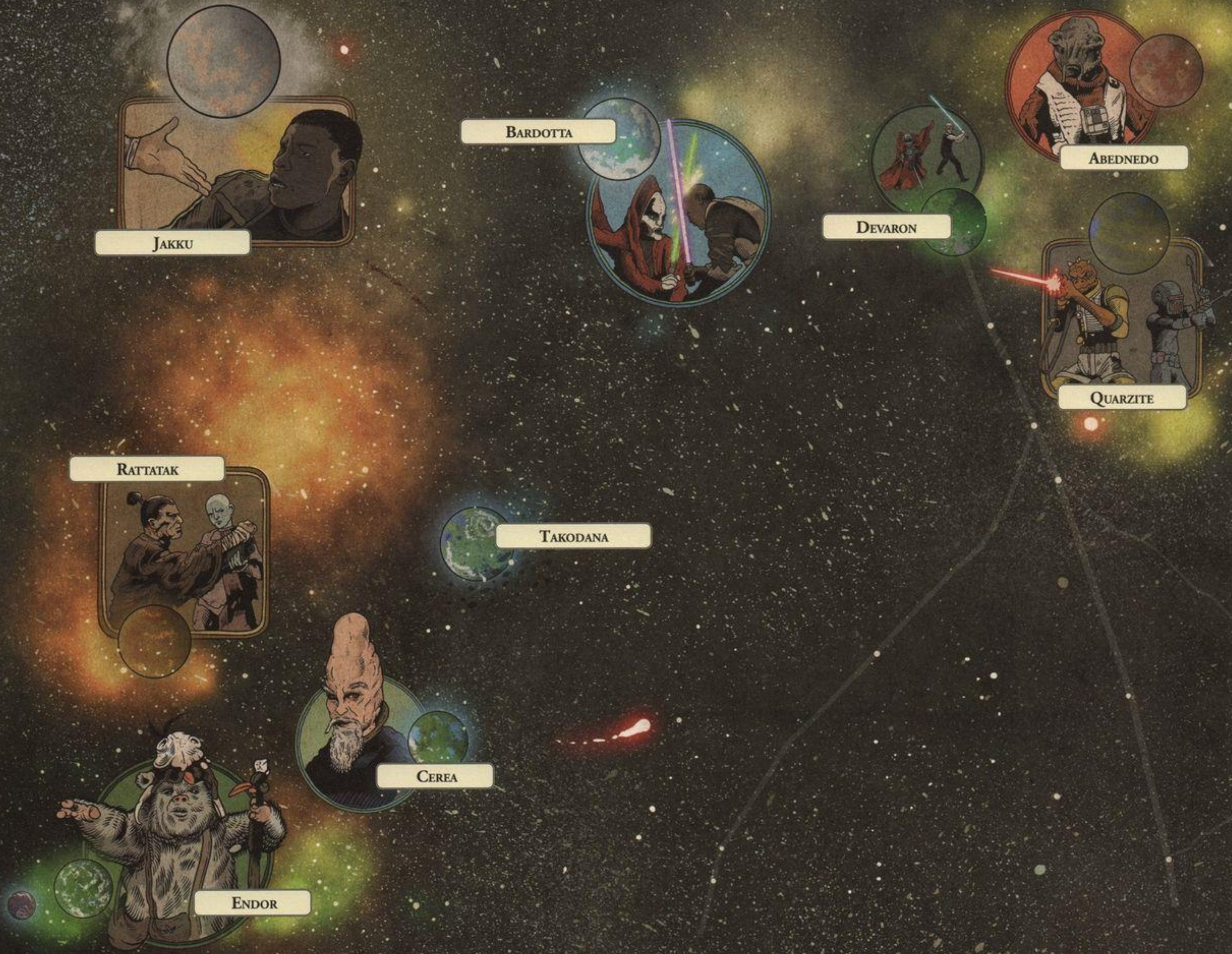
Investigators patrol the chilly sands of Jedha on long-legged mounts.

ABEDNEDO TO TATOOINE

ABEDNEDO: Emperor Palpatine's last cruel order, Operation: Cinder, was a revenge scheme that was to be put into effect upon his death. It targeted entire worlds for destruction, including Abednedo. An Abednedo pilot, Ello Asty, later flew for the Resistance at Starkiller base.

BARDOTTA: A frozen, mountainous planet whose people are fascinated by mysticism. During the Clone Wars, Jedi Master Mace Windu and Jar Jar Binks foiled a plot by a sinister cult to drain Bardottan Queen Julia's life energy and channel it into their leader, Mother Talzin.

BOTHAWUI: Dense rings of asteroids around the gas giant Bothawui offer a masterclass for pilots, who must be highly skilled to navigate them. It was the scene of a major space battle during the Clone Wars, in which the tactical genius of Anakin Skywalker helped defeat General Grievous.



JAKKU: Jakku is littered with the wreckage of starships that fell from orbit during the last great battle of the Galactic Civil War. Scavengers comb the debris for salvage. One scavenger, Rey, was abandoned on Jakku as a child and was later caught up in the struggle between the Resistance and the First Order.

MALASTARE: The homeworld of the Dug species, Malastare is a forest world whose core is rich in valuable fuel. During the Clone Wars, the Republic tested an electro-proton bomb here, designed to knock out droid armies. However, it awakened the colossal Zillo Beast, which then went on a rampage.

NABOO: One of the galaxy's most beautiful worlds, with lush grasslands, winding rivers, and tall waterfalls. The crust of the planet is riddled with holes and passages, which are filled with water. These can be used as a quick means of submarine travel from one part of the planet to another.

Naboo was the homeworld of the Sith Lord Darth Sidious. Born Sheev Palpatine, his scheming made him first a senator, then Supreme Chancellor, then Emperor. The Trade Federation's invasion of his home planet was one of the first moves in his grand plan to seize control of the galaxy.

QUARZITE: The surface of Quarzite cannot support life. Its inhabitants, the Belugans and the Kage, fought a long war for control of the underground crystal caverns. Access to these caverns is only possible using a giant turbolift, which leads from an orbiting space station down into the planet's crust.

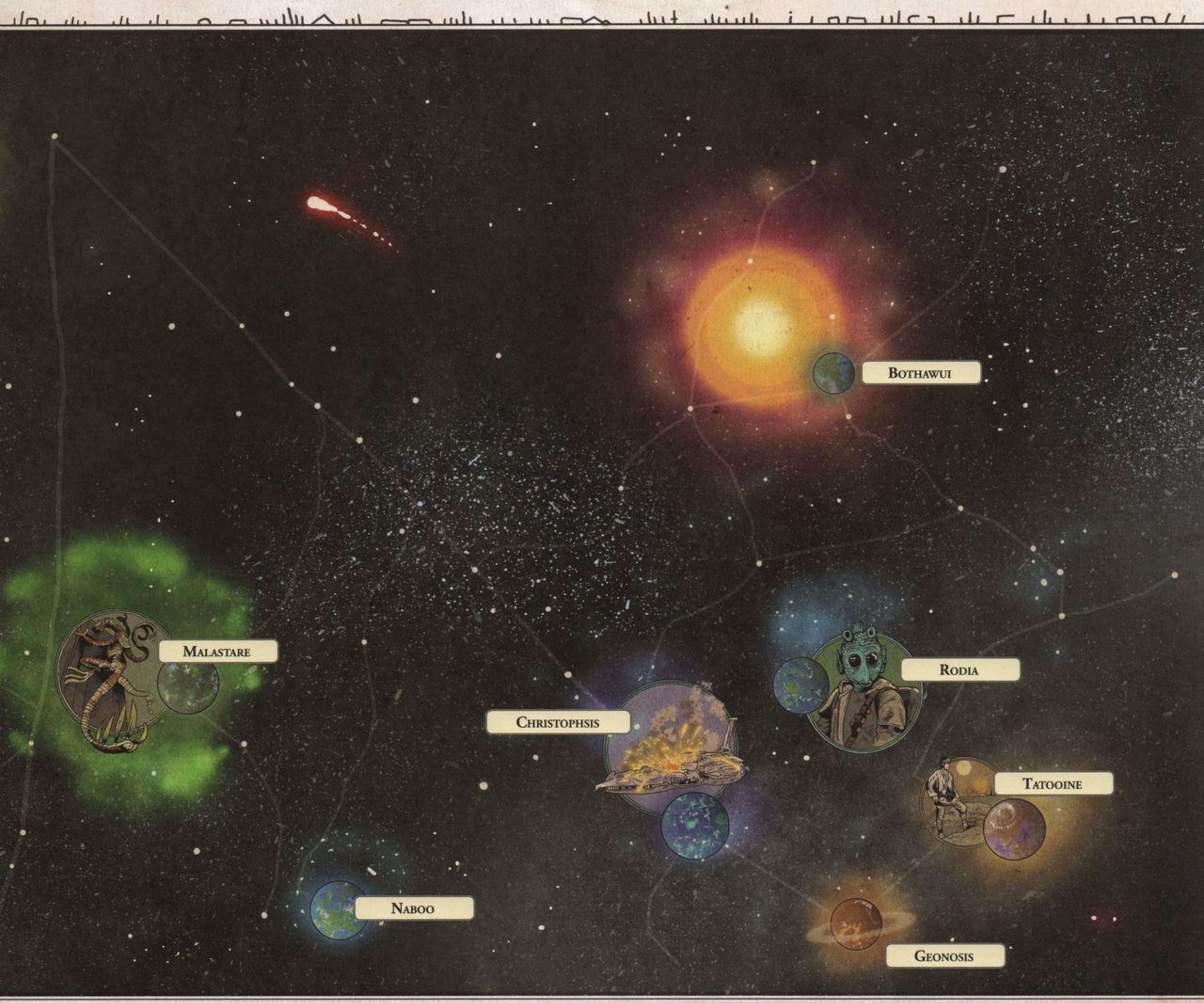
CEREA: A beautiful world, largely unspoiled by the ravages of technology. It is home to the Cerean people, whose towering cone-shaped skulls contain a binary brain. Ki-Adi-Mundi was a famous Cerean Jedi Master who won many victories during the Clone Wars with his Galactic Marines.

CHRISTOPHSIS: Crystal forests cover the surface of Christophsis with tall jagged peaks of turquoise rising from fields of hexagonal "tiles." A fierce battle was fought here in the early days of the Clone Wars, in which generals Kenobi and Skywalker triumphed over the Separatist Whorm Loathsom.

DEVARON: A green and pleasant world of forests, rivers, and tropical jungles, inhabited by the Devaronian species. The Jedi Temple on Devaron was attacked during the Clone Wars by the monstrous Savage Opress, who slew Jedi Master Halsey. Later, Luke Skywalker honed his lightsaber skills here.

ENDOR: This small forest moon orbits the gas giant of the same name. It is home to the furry Ewoks, the swamp-dwelling Duloks, and the Yuzzums of the grasslands. Endor was famously the scene of the titanic battle in which the second Death Star was destroyed and Emperor Palpatine perished.

GEONOSIS: An arid world whose insectoid inhabitants were skilled in engineering. The vast factories of Geonosis created millions of battle droids for the Separatists, and the Empire began to construct the first Death Star in orbit. Later, the planet was sterilized, killing almost all life.



RATTATAK: A dry, rocky world plagued by the attacks of pirates and warlords. One pirate, Hal'Sted, owned a slave—the young Asajj Ventress. When Hal'Sted was killed on Rattatak, the Jedi Ky Narec took in Ventress and began to train her. His death at the hands of pirates led her to fall to the dark side.

RODIA: A warm, damp planet of swamps and jungles, Rodia is the homeworld of the Rodian species. During the Clone Wars, Rodia wavered between supporting the Republic and supporting the Separatists, but eventually Senator Padmé Amidala helped sway them to the Republic's cause.

TAKODANA: Situated halfway between the Core worlds and the wild frontier, Takodana is a popular stop for travelers, explorers, fugitives, and smugglers. The famous pirate Maz Kanata owned a castle here, where strange beings from all over the galaxy gathered to relax or do business.

TATOOINE: What little moisture there is on dusty Tatooine has to be extracted from the air by vaporators and is crucial to the survival of life. Humans and others scratch out a living here alongside the native Tusken Raiders—also known as the Sand People—and the Jawas who scavenge the sands.

A largely lawless world, Tatooine is controlled by the Hutt clans and is a hub of criminal activity. Smugglers and bounty hunters flock to shady dives in ports like Mos Eisley while gamblers bet on deadly podracers and back-room sabacc games in Mos Espa and elsewhere.

34 ABY: The sacred village of Tuanul is populated by members of the Church of the Force.

34 ABY: First Order troops, led by Kyle Ren and Captain Phasma, destroy the village of Tuanul and execute all who live there.



34 ABY: BB-8, entrusted with secret information by Poe Dameron, flees the village's destruction.

34 ABY: With First Order TIE fighters in pursuit, Finn and Rey escape Jakku in an old YT-1300 freighter.



MILLENNIUM FALCON

JAKKU

The desolate planet Jakku was the scene of the last great battle between the Galactic Empire and the Rebel Alliance, a year after the death of the Emperor. The Graveyard of Giants—a vast plain of crashed starships—attracted scavengers, who sold their salvaged technology to local traders. Few people come to Jakku by choice.

4 ABY: The Battle of Jakku leaves the surface of the planet littered with debris, and the starship graveyard is formed.

4 ABY: A capital ship crashes into the planet, fusing the sand into glass and burying itself deep under the surface—the Spike in the Cradle.

34 ABY: Rey's background is shrouded in mystery. She escapes a living as a scavenger while she awaits her family's return.

34 ABY: Old Murr's is a stop along the Pilgrim's Road, where shade and a water trough for happabores can be found.

34 ABY: A stolen TIE fighter piloted by Poe Dameron crashes in the Sinking Fields. His passenger, Finn, escapes the wreck.



CRATERTOWN

Cratertown is one of Jakku's older settlements. Scavenging is a major industry, as is kassium gas mining.

The Gozons Bullheads extend from Carbon Ridge to the Sinking Fields, and from Kelvin Ravine to Niima Outpost.



LEGGABEAST

34 ABY: A Tardos and his leggabest find and capture BB-8 for salvage.

34 ABY: Finn makes his way through the desert to Niima Outpost.



34 ABY: The scavenger Rey lives in the wreck of this Imperial AT-AT. It is here that she rescues BB-8 from the Tardos.

REY'S SPEEDER

34 ABY: The First Order tracks Finn and BB-8 to Niima Outpost, and its TIE fighters attack.



CONESTABLE ZUVIO

34 ABY: Niima Outpost, named after the Hatt outlaw who founded it, is a trading post for Jakku's scavengers. Conestable Zuvio keeps the peace.



NIIMA OUTPOST

UNRAK PLUTT

34 ABY: Unrak Plutt, known as "the Blobfish," is the junkshop at Niima Outpost. His prices are unfair, but his customers have no choice.



34 ABY: Bobbajo the Gormonger dies in animals. He claims his creatures were responsible for the destruction of the first Death Star, but few believe him.



BOBBAJO

ENDOR

This small forest moon, orbiting the planet Endor, was just another remote galactic backwater until the end of the Galactic Civil War, when it was the scene of a decisive battle. The Ewoks of the Endor moon, while short in size, proved invaluable allies. They caused havoc while the second Death Star's shield generator was assaulted by the commando team led by General Solo.

General Solo/Vulko team arrives on the Endor moon in a stolen Imperial shuttle, the *Tydirian*.



Luke Skywalker meets his father, Darth Vader, and begs him to return to the light. Vader refuses and takes his son to the Death Star to meet his master, the Emperor.



The Emperor sets up an ambush on the sanctuary moon.



Ewoks capture the strike team but mistake C-3PO for a god. The droid persuades them to release his friends.



BRIGHT TREE VILLAGE

The chief of the Ewok village is Chirpa and the shaman is Logray.



Yuzzanes, like the singer Joh Yonka, are native to Endor.



An energy shield, protecting the unfinished Death Star, is projected from the moon's surface.



The rebel strike team engages an Imperial scout trooper patrol.



With the help of the Ewoks, Chewbacca captures an Imperial AT-ST walker.



Imperial scout troopers and AT-STs are deployed on the Endor moon, anticipating a rebel attack.



Rebel commandos see the responsibility of General Madine, a veteran guerrilla fighter.



Ewoks use guerrilla tactics and running traps to snare the Imperial forces.



The rebels join forces with the Ewoks and plan a raid on the shield generator.



The mountains of Endor are home to the giant Gevva species.



BATTLE OF ENDOR

The second Death Star is even larger and more powerful than the first, and the rebels plan an all-out raid to destroy it before it becomes operational. However, they are being lured into a trap, designed to end the Galactic Civil War in the Empire's favor. As General Solo's commando team tries to take down the station's protective shield, a battle rages in orbit. . . .

The Emperor reveals that the rebels have stepped into his trap. The battle station is fully operational! It fires on the Mon Calamari star cruiser *Liberty*, destroying it.

EMPEROR PALPATINE

Luke Skywalker and Darth Vader duel as the Emperor tries to turn the young Jedi to the dark side. Skywalker strikes his father down but then refuses to kill him and surrenders.

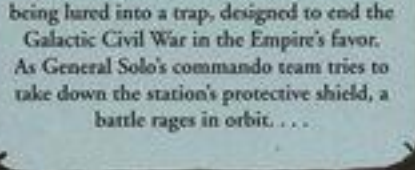

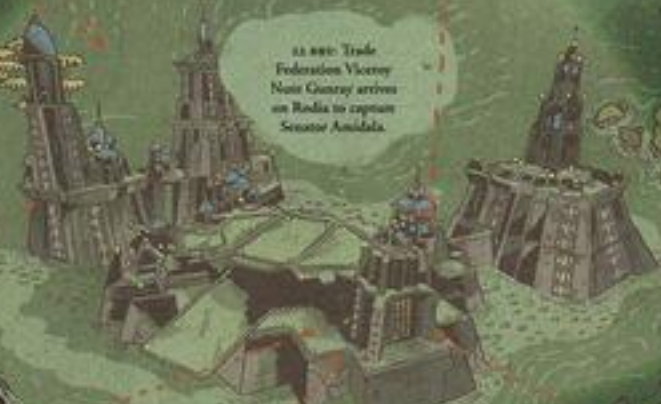

24 880: Padmé Amidala arrives on Rodia to persuade Senator Otaonde Furr to stay loyal to the Republic.



22 880: Posing as a Jedi, the bounty hunter Cad Bane takes a Force-sensitive Rodian child away on the orders of Senator Palpatine, who plots to use his powers for evil.



The swamps of Rodia are home to countless varieties of snakes.



Ghosts are deadly, snake-like predators that can bite a humanoid in half. Luke Skywalker drew one near the tomb of the Jedi Master.



GEONOSIS

A rocky desert world inhabited by an insectoid race, whose great domes and spires resemble natural formations. Geonosis was long renowned for its manufacturing industries. The Separatist droid armies were built here, and the first Death Star was partially constructed in orbit. Later, however, the Empire ruthlessly sterilized the planet.

Clone troopers arrive in gunships known as Low Altitude Assault Transports.



LOW ALTITUDE ASSAULT TRANSPORT

The Empire later harvested the engineering abilities of the Geonosians, who helped construct the Death Star.



Geonosians battle droids are forged in Geonosis's vast automated factories.

Count Dooku meets with Separatist leaders including the Trade Federation, Banking Clan, and Techno Union.



11 889: Obi-Wan contacts the Jedi Council to warn them about Dooku's plan.



11 889: In a factory hallway, C-3PO's head is accidentally attached to a battle droid's body.



11 889: Mace Windu slays Jango Fett while his clone-son, Boba, watches in horror.



11 889: Obi-Wan, Anakin, and Padmé are captured and chained in the arena, where giant beasts attack them.

11 889: Anakin droids Q-9 and R3-L1 make short work of the queen's battle droids.



11 889: Anakin Skywalker and Luminara Unduli arrive on Geonosis to capture the planet for the Republic.



11 889: Mace Windu leads the Jedi into battle, but they are outnumbered and surrounded by battle droids.



THE SECOND BATTLE OF GEONOSIS

11 889: Despite heavy losses, the Republic forces prevail. The Geonosis droid factory is destroyed—a heavy blow to the Separatist war effort.



11 889: Queen Karina captures Jedi Master Luminara Unduli and crushes her using a brain worm.



11 889: The Geonosis queen, Karina the Great, rules over the Geonosians and has learned to control the minds of others using the brain worms.



11 889: Padawan Ahsoka Tano and Barriss Offee undertake a daring mission to sabotage a droid factory while their masters, Skywalker and Unduli, distract the enemy.

11 889: Count Dooku defeats Obi-Wan and Anakin in battle, but then Master Yoda intervenes and droids his wild apprentice.



Brain worms can turn intelligent beings into mind-controlled zombies.



Geonosians live in vast hive-spines.



11 889: With his forces decimated by the Jedi's new clone troopers, Dooku flees to a secret hangar where his solar sailer awaits.



TATOOINE

Once described as the place farthest away from the bright center of the universe, the remote desert planet Tatooine bakes beneath its twin suns. It is home to two native species, Jawas and Tusken, as well as a wide variety of newcomers. Tatooine is famous as the homeworld of two great Jedi—Anakin and Luke Skywalker.

Mos Espa

A port city run by the Hutt Clan, Mos Espa is known for its dangerous podracing circuit and especially the famous Boonta Eve Classic Podrace.



11,889: Junk dealer Watto, a Toydarian, makes a bet with Qui-Gon Jinn on a podrace. The stakes are a new hyperdrive for Queen Amidala's ship and the freedom of a slave boy named Anakin Skywalker.



19,889: Following the Jedi Purge, Obi-Wan Kenobi brought the infant Luke Skywalker to Tatooine. He would watch over the child for the next 19 years.



Old Ben Kenobi

0,889: Luke Skywalker, out searching for R2-D2, is menaced by a gang of Sand People but rescued at the last moment by Obi-Wan Kenobi.



Banths are used by the Sand People as mounts and beasts of burden.



Deshaaks are large reptilian bears, so named because they drink the morning dew that condenses on their backs.



0,889: Separated from each other, R2-D2 and C-3PO are both captured by Jawa scavengers.



0,889: The escape pod launched from the *Tantive IV* blockade runner crashes in the desert. Its occupants, the droids R2-D2 and C-3PO, set off in search of help while Imperial troops track them.



"LOOK, MR. DROIDE!"

Warras are large warty predators that conical themselves in the desert sands to await wayward prey.



LOOPER

Jabba the Hutt's palace on Tatooine was once the site of a monastery run by the Brannari Order.



JABBA'S PALACE



11,889: Darth Maul tracks Qui-Gon Jinn, his Padawan Obi-Wan, and Queen Amidala to Tatooine, where he clashes with the Jedi Master.



NABOO ROYAL STARSHIP

Sand People travel single file, to hide their numbers.



BANTHAN

11,889: When his mother, Shmi, dies at the hands of the Sand People, Anakin Skywalker gives in to his anger and slaughters the entire tribe.



THE GREAT PIT OF CARKOON

4,889: The Great Pit of Carkoon contains a terrible surface, and was a favorite site for Jabba to dispose of his enemies. Luke Skywalker destroyed Jabba's sail barge here.

RONTU

Rontus are popular mounts among Jawas.



MOS EISLEY



Mos Eisley speeders, once described as a "wretched hive of scum and villainy."



Luke Skywalker learned to fly on Tatooine, piloting a T-16 Skyhopper.



T-16

The moisture farm owned by Owen and Beru Lars, where Luke Skywalker grew up.



A small outpost outside the town of Anchorhead and a meeting place for local farmers.



TRUCKER STATION

CHRISTOPHISIS

Christophsis is known for its crystal landscape, with vast plains of hexagonal gems and jagged forests of spires. It was the site of a desperate battle during the Clone Wars, in which Republic forces under General Kenobi and General Skywalker defeated a Separatist invasion force.

Anakin Skywalker gets an unexpected surprise as he is introduced to his new Padawan apprentice, Ahsoka Tano.



Clone troopers of the 501st Legion fight a desperate battle against the Separatist battle droids.



Clone troopers set up powerful artillery positions to beat back the Separatist advance.



Republic commander ambushes the battle droids from zip lines.



Captain Rex is the first to spot the Separatist's energy shield. His squad, Torrent Company, takes heavy casualties fighting with the battle droids.



The Jedi Kenobi, Skywalker, and Tano, along with Clone Captain Rex and R2-D2, discuss battle tactics.



The Separatist forces are protected by an energy shield that moves as they advance, leading the Jedi Anakin Skywalker and Ahsoka Tano to mount a stealth raid.



LR-57 combat droids protect the Separatist shield generators, but the Jedi nevertheless destroy them.



A traitorous clone trooper, Slick, is found to be passing information to the Separatists. Commander Cody knocks him out.



Anakin Skywalker destroys the Separatist's Occupantia combat tri-droids.



Separatist forces on Christophsis are led by the Kerkuloid general Whorm Loathsum.

GENERAL WHORM LOATHSUM



Battle droids advance on the clone trooper positions in seemingly endless waves.



Obi-Wan Kenobi stalls for time as Anakin and Ahsoka assault the Separatist's shield generator. His scheme pays off, and the Republic is victorious.



NABOO

A small but beautiful jewel of a world, Naboo was the home planet of Queen Padmé Amidala and Senator Sheev Palpatine—who would go on to rule the galaxy as Emperor. Naboo is inhabited by the human society of the same name and the native Gungans, an amphibious race who live in underwater cities.

THEED

The beautiful city of Theed is the capital of the Naboo. Van waterfalls cascade over the cliffs on which it perches. Beneath the Royal Palace is a hangar and a generator complex.



QUEEN PADMÉ AMIDALA
The young Anakin Skywalker accidentally steals a Naboo Starfighter and pilots it into orbit.



ROYAL PALACE
The young Anakin Skywalker accidentally steals a Naboo Starfighter and pilots it into orbit.



GENERATOR COMPLEX
The sinister Sith Lord Darth Maul strikes down Qui-Gon Jinn in the palace's generator complex.



OBI-WAN KENOBI
Obi-Wan Kenobi avenges the death of his master by defeating Darth Maul. The swordsman is cut in two and falls into the depths of the facility.



QUEEN PADMÉ AMIDALA
Naboo is ruled by an elected king or queen. At the time of the invasion, the queen was Padmé Amidala, who served two terms.



ANAKIN SKYWALKER
Jedi Knight Anakin Skywalker is secretly married to Padmé Amidala.



BATTLE OF NABOO
The Battle of Naboo is fought between the Gungans and the Trade Federation's battle droids. All seems lost until the Droid Control Ship is destroyed in orbit by Anakin Skywalker.



SENATOR SHEEV PALPATINE
Bounty hunter Cad Bane kidnaps Chancellor Palpatine during the Festival of Light, but the plot is thwarted by an undercover Obi-Wan Kenobi.

Docile, plant-eating shaks are loved for food and sometimes used as pack animals.



GUNGAN WARRIOR

LIANORM SWAMP

Predatory tuk-cats are found on Naboo and can be used as mounts.



TUK-CAT

The Gungan Sacred Place is an ancient monument, important to the Gungans, north of the Lianorm Swamp. A treaty with the Naboo was signed here.



QUI-GON JINN
Jedi Master Qui-Gon Jinn and his Padawan Obi-Wan Kenobi escape the Trade Federation and land on Naboo to warn the queen. They meet a Gungan musician, Jar Jar Binks.



JAR JAR BINKS



BOSS NUU
The Gungans are ruled by a High Council, chaired by a lion. At the time of the invasion, Boss Nuu is in charge.



OTTOH GUNGA

The city of Ottoh Gunga is the underwater capital of the Gungans. The tough bubbles that it is made from are grown by the Gungans from the planet's natural plants.



PLANET CORE
Naboo's crust is porous and full of water. A biogen submarine can travel great distances beneath the surface, if it does not run into giant sea beasts like the colo-lava fish, apes, or saods.

NEVO VINDI
The insane Doctor Nevo Vindi, working for the Separatists, engineers the deadly Blue Shadow Virus in his secret laboratory.



NEVO VINDI

Gungan warriors ride kashas into battle and are armed with atlatls—long, flexible wooden poles that can sling explosives up to 30 meters.



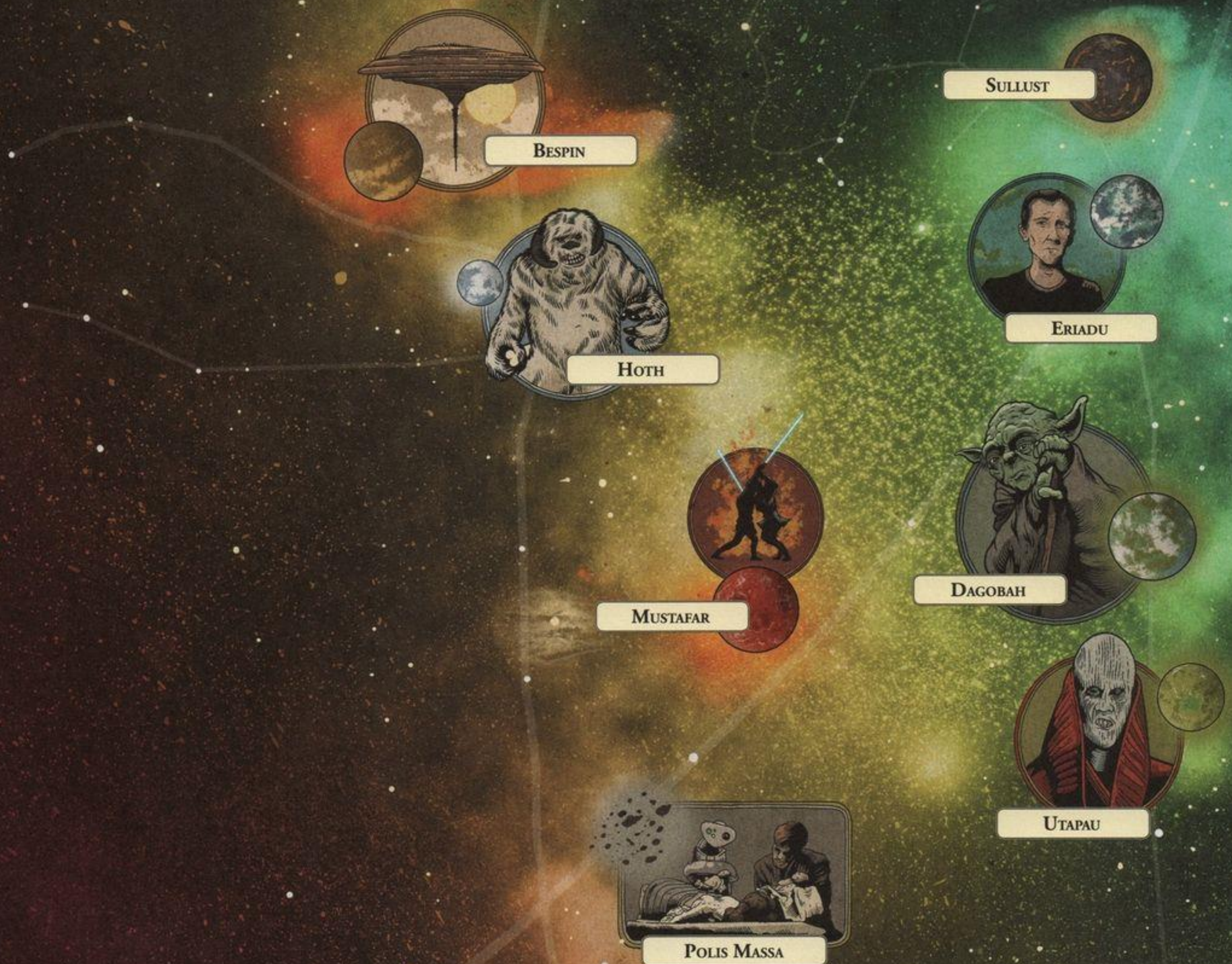

ANDELM IV TO UTAPAU

ANDELM IV: A remote world known for its beetles, a source of the rare mineral dedlanite. During the Galactic Civil War, a crime lord named Jaum enslaved the population, forcing them to harvest dedlanite for the Empire. His plans were foiled by the Wookiee Chewbacca and his friend Zarro.

ARKANIS: Rain falls endlessly on gloomy Arkanis, ranging from drizzle to thunderstorms. The Empire built an academy here, run by Commandant Brendol Hux, to train a generation of elite officers. It was also the site of Project Harvester, where Force-sensitive children were brought for mysterious purposes.

BESPIN: A gas giant with no land, just layers of dense gas through which strange creatures swim. Valuable tibanna gas is collected from vast creatures called beldons and processed in the floating habitats in the upper, breathable layer of atmosphere, including the famous Cloud City.



KAMINO: This world is not on any maps. As part of an elaborate plot by Darth Sidious, it was erased from the Jedi Archives and only rediscovered when Obi-Wan Kenobi was investigating the attempted assassination of the Naboo senator Padmé Amidala. Kenobi traced the would-be

assassin to the Wild Space planet Kamino, an endless ocean whose inhabitants had mastered the science of cloning. The Kaminoans had been paid to create a clone army for the Republic, using the DNA of the bounty hunter Jango Fett—the assassin Kenobi was following.

MUSTAFAR: Lava spews from the volcanoes that cover Mustafar's surface while swarms of droids harvest rare minerals from the molten rock. Despite the searing heat of this harsh world, it is inhabited by the native Mustafarians, who labor in the mines and factories and live in underground caverns

hollowed out by rock-eating lava fleas.

Many dark deeds have taken place on Mustafar. Darth Vader betrayed and slew the Separatist Council here, ending the Clone Wars. He was then defeated and horribly maimed by Obi-Wan Kenobi.

POLIS MASSA: Once a planet, Polis Massa was mysteriously shattered into an asteroid field. A scientific base here studies the disaster, and following Order 66, Yoda and Obi-Wan Kenobi found safety at the research station. It was here that Luke Skywalker and Leia Organa were born.

DAGOBAH: Grand Master Yoda once described Dagobah as “one of the purest places in the galaxy.” He first came here toward the end of the Clone Wars, drawn by a strange message from his old friend Qui-Gon Jinn, who had died many years earlier. Jinn had discovered the secret to

maintaining his identity after death and set Yoda on the path to discover it for himself.

Following his failure to defeat Emperor Palpatine, Yoda exiled himself to Dagobah to meditate on the Force until a new hope could arise. It was here that he met Luke Skywalker.

D’QAR: An obscure, tree-covered planet with no intelligent life and far from the main space lanes, D’Qar is of little interest. This made it a perfect choice as a secret base for the Rebel Alliance and later the Resistance—making it a target for the First Order’s Starkiller weapon.

ERIADU: A once-savage wilderness of a world, until colonists tamed it. Among the early pioneers were the Tarkin family, who formed their own militia to protect against pirates and the local wildlife. Wilhuff Tarkin grew up here and learned many harsh lessons in survival.

HOTH: The frozen world Hoth was chosen as the new headquarters of the Rebel Alliance following the Battle of Yavin. The base was discovered by an Imperial probe droid, and Darth Vader moved swiftly to invade the planet. The rebels only narrowly escaped the Echo Base’s destruction.

ANDELM IV

RYLOTH: Ryloth has seen more than its share of war. During the Clone Wars, it was a battleground between the Republic and the Separatists as Mace Windu and his forces fought to liberate the planet. Later, freedom fighter Cham Syndulla opposed the Empire’s cruel occupation.

A plot by Syndulla and his Free Ryloth group led to Emperor Palpatine and Darth Vader crash-landing on the planet after the Star Destroyer they were traveling in, the *Perilous*, was sabotaged and destroyed. However, the Lords of the Sith were able to escape the assassination attempt.

SULLUST: A barren world of volcanoes and lakes whose people live in vast underground cities. Half of all Sullustans work for the SoroSuub technology corporation. Sullustans are well known as pilots. Nien Nunb famously copiloted the *Millennium Falcon* at the battle of Endor.

UTAPAU: Hyperwind storms batter the surface of Utapau, forcing many of the planet’s inhabitants—the Utai and Pau’ans—to live in the giant sinkholes that lead down into the planet’s crust. The Amani, recent settlers on Utapau, are hardy enough to dwell above ground in the grasslands.

During the Clone Wars, Utapau was an important base for the Separatists, and it was here that Obi-Wan Kenobi tracked down General Grievous and challenged him to a duel. After a fierce battle, the Jedi Master managed to tear open the cyborg’s armor and destroy him using his own blaster.

BATTLE OF HOTH

Darth Vader's forces discovered the rebel base on Hoth two years after the Empire's defeat at the Battle of Yavin. An overwhelming assault drove the rebels from the planet, but a fatal mistake by the Imperial Admiral Ozzel meant that Vader's plan to crush the Rebellion failed.

Lines of trenches are dug into the snow, and blaster cannons are set up, but the rebel weapons cannot penetrate the AT-AT's armor.



With the power generator in range, AT-ATs train their heavy firepower on it and destroy the planetary shield.



Rebel troops desperately try to hold off the Imperial advance until the evacuation can be completed.



Once an Imperial pilot, Thane Kyrill now flies for the rebels—and now fights against his lover, Cassa Rex.



Wedge Antilles uses the tow cable on his snowspeeder to entangle an AT-AT's legs, bringing it crashing to the ground.



On patrol, Luke Skywalker is ambushed by a vicious wampa and awakens in the bear's lair.



Having escaped the wampa's cave, Luke is visited by the spirit of Old Wren Kenobi, who tells him to go to the Dagobah system. Luke is then rescued by his friend Han Solo.

With the rebels fleeing, Darth Vader arrives at Echo Base but is unable to prevent the Millennium Falcon from slipping away.

Echo Base is built under the surface of the planet, to conceal it from prying eyes.

ECHO BASE

Rebel forces escape the planet, breaking through the Imperial blockade.

Twi'lek society is organized into clans. Each clan has its own settlement.



11 800: LAAT/i gunships and Acclamator assault ships fly toward Nohar as Republic troops begin their campaign to liberate the planet.



AT-RT

RYLOTH

The homeworld of the Twi'lek species, Ryloth is a warm world with many volcanoes, jungles, and valleys. The planet was the scene of decades of fierce resistance by guerrilla fighters, first against the invading Separatists and later against the Galactic Empire.



11 800: Jedi Master Ima-Gun Di makes a heroic last stand against Separatist forces, sacrificing his life to secure vital supplies.

The most fearsome of all beasts on Ryloth—the terrifying lyth.



JIXUAN DESERT

11 800: Mace Windu's liberating forces advance on the capital.



11 800: Twi'lek rebel Cham Syndulla is a key figure in the Ryloth resistance, helping liberate the planet from the Separatists. Later, his rebel cell enters close to destroying the Emperor and Darth Vader.

11 800: Separatist general Wat Tambor surrenders to Republic forces commanded by Mace Windu as the planet is liberated.



11 800: Cham Syndulla's daughter Hera, an ace pilot, leaves Ryloth to fight the Empire.



DRUA'S VILLAGE



Gothioks are deadly predators, part reptile and part insect. The Separatists unleashed them against clone troops outside Nohar.



14 800: Twi'lek rebels sabotage a ship carrying Emperor Palpatine and Darth Vader, and the Sith Lords crash-land on Ryloth. They destroy a Twi'lek village to cover their tracks.

KAMINO

This remote ocean planet is home to the Kaminoans, a race that has mastered the technology of cloning. Here the Grand Army of the Republic was created from the DNA of the bounty hunter Jango Fett. The planet was deleted from the Jedi Archives by the renegade Count Dooku to conceal the secret cloning project and only rediscovered in 22 BBY by Obi-Wan Kenobi.

At the time of the Clone Wars, the prime minister of Kamino was Lama Su.



21 BBY: Obi-Wan Kenobi is rescued twice, during the Battle of Kamino, by airhas.



The vast cloning factories of Kamino could create whole armies of soldiers in a relatively short time.



22 BBY: Separatist agents are deadly enemies on water worlds like Kamino. Jedi Master Shon Ti, however, makes short work of them.

The majestic airhas—or air whales—are native to Kamino. These peaceful creatures may be used as mounts.

22 BBY: Obi-Wan Kenobi confronts Jango Fett, who is behind the assassination attempt on Padmé Amidala. But the bounty hunter escapes.

TIPOCA CITY



22 BBY: Anakin Skywalker attempts to steal the genetic material used to create the clones but is fought off by Anakin Skywalker.



22 BBY: Obi-Wan Kenobi meets Jango Fett and his clone son, Boba. He is suspicious of the Mandalorian warrior from the start.



22 BBY: General Grievous leads a Separatist assault on Kamino, hoping to destroy the Republic's supply of clone troops.



WOLFE: Leader of the clone squad known as the Wolf Pack, under Jedi Master Plo Koon. He survived the Clone Wars and later befriended the rebek.

DUGMA: Member of the elite 501st Legion. Dugma is notable as the trooper who rescued the Jedi General Pong Krell in 21 BBY.

FYER: Homicide elite ARC trooper who discovered Palpatine's plans to destroy the Jedi, but he was framed and killed before he could reveal the truth.

ECHO: An ARC trooper and member of the 501st, decorated several times for bravery. He was seemingly killed during the rescue of Jedi Master Eeth Kull.

COBY: As a Clone Marshal, Coby commanded the 7th Sky Corps. He worked closely with Jedi Master Kenobi and he attempted to kill him during Order 66.

REX: A loyal, brave ARC trooper who often fought alongside Anakin Skywalker in the 501st. Later, he befriended the Rebellion.

HARDCASE: Reckless but deadly with his master cannon, Hardcase feared nothing. He sacrificed his life to save his squad during the Battle of Umbara.

WAXER: A member of Ghost Company, Waxer helped liberate Ryloth and Geonosis. He was killed as a result of Pong Krell's treachery at Umbara.

TIP: All clones had his chip in their brains to make them follow Order 66, but Tip's activated early, causing him to kill a Jedi. He died on Kamino.

JESS: An ARC trooper and 501st Legion member, Jess served on Saleucami, Umbara, Kijime, and Anaxes, under Anakin Skywalker.

HEVY: A heavy-weapon expert, Hevy was stationed on the Kishi moon listening post when Separatist forces attacked. He sacrificed himself to warn the Republic.

99: 99, a failed clone of Jango Fett, worked on the janitorial staff of the Kamino training facility. He was wise and beloved by his clone brothers.

19 88Y: Guided by the voice of Qui-Gon Jinn, Yoda travels to Dagobah, where his old friend appears to him in the form of a swarm of fireflies.

Giant amphibians slugs lurk in the swamps of Dagobah.

The huge, tusked elephant is native to Dagobah, where it blends in with the environment thanks to its mossy hide.

DAGOBAH

A remote swamp world, teeming with life, Dagobah was the planet chosen by Jedi Master Yoda when he exiled himself following the triumph of Emperor Palpatine and where Luke Skywalker trained in the ways of the Jedi. A cave on the planet strong with the dark side of the Force provided a test of Skywalker's wisdom.

The jabbu bird makes its nest from mud and is known for its soothing song.

Dragonsnakes are deadly predators that live in the muddy waters of Dagobah, among other planets. A dragonsnake attempted to devour R2-D2 but had to spit him out.

4 88Y: Yoda mentally communicates with Kansas Janna and Ezra Bridger.

1 88Y: Yoda begins to train Luke Skywalker. "A Jedi uses the Force for knowledge and defense, never attack," Yoda says.

1 88Y: Luke Skywalker arrives on Dagobah looking for Master Yoda. He fails to recognize the legendary Jedi at first. . . .

3 88Y: Yoda raises Luke's X-wing from the lagoon where it crashed. "Size matters not," he tells Luke.

1 88Y: Yoda's humble home on Dagobah is partly constructed from the lifeboat that he traveled to the planet in.

3 88Y: Yoda trains Luke's agility and Force abilities.

3 88Y: Luke senses that his friends are in danger and rushes to confront Darth Vader. Yoda and the spirit of Obi-Wan try to persuade him to complete his training first.

4 88Y: Yoda at last becomes one with the Force, peacefully in his home.

DOMAIN OF EVIL

1 88Y: Luke Skywalker is misled by Yoda and enters a cave that is strong with the dark side. Though Yoda tells him that he will not need his weapons, he strikes down a vision of Darth Vader with his lightsaber—only to discover his own face behind the mask.

Skrews are insect-eating lizards that live in holes in the ground or hollowed-out logs.

Spiders walk the swamps, poring on the airway.

Rauwaks are winged carnivores that prey on Bispin's air shrimps.

BESPIN

The gas giant Bispin is an important source of the rare tibanna gas that, once refined, is used in hyperdrive systems. People live in cities floating within the thin habitable band of atmosphere surrounding the planet. One city—Cloud City—was run by Baron Administrator Lando Calrissian and would play an important part in the Galactic Civil War.

Having evaded the Imperial Fleet at Hoth, the crew of the Millennium Falcon pulls into Cloud City for hyperdrive repairs.

The bounty hunter Boba Fett leads a carbon-frozen Han Solo onto his ship, Slave I, and sets off to collect his payment from gang boss Jabba the Hutt.

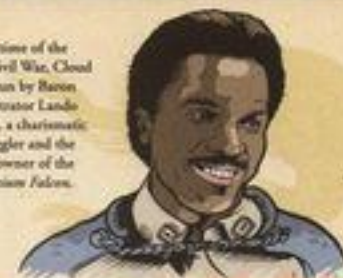
CLOUD CITY

The city has 302 levels. The top 50 levels are a luxury resort while the lower levels house gas miners and their equipment.

Boba Fett tracks the Millennium Falcon to Cloud City and informs Darth Vader. The Sith Lord sets a trap for Luke Skywalker, using his friends to lure him.

At the time of the Galactic Civil War, Cloud City is run by Baron Administrator Lando Calrissian, a charismatic ex-smuggler and the former owner of the Millennium Falcon.

Lando's old comrade Lobot is the computer-liaison officer on Cloud City. His cybernetic implants enable him to interface directly with the city's network.



C-3PO opens the wrong door and is blasted by the stormtroopers who have secretly arrived with Darth Vader.



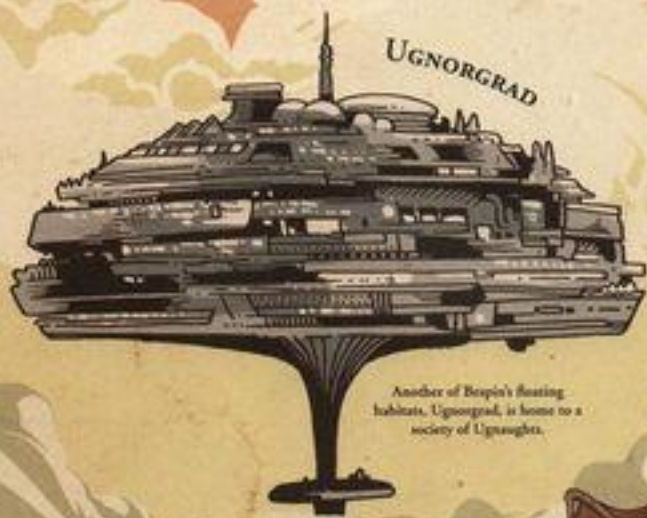
Swarms of air shrimp float in Bispin's upper atmosphere.



Ugnaughts do much of the physical labor involved with processing tibanna gas, including the carbon-freezing process that is needed to export it.



When he senses that his friends are in danger, Luke Skywalker abandons his Jedi training and rushes to Cloud City to confront Vader.



Another of Bispin's floating habitats, Ugnorgrad, is home to a society of Ugnaughts.



Chewbacca begins to put C-3PO back together. The droid eventually makes a full recovery.



Luke falls from the carbon-freezing chamber, through a shaft, and manages to cling on to an antenna at the bottom of the structure. He calls to Leia using the Force and is rescued.



The experienced Sith Lord easily defeats the untrained Skywalker, chopping off his right hand. He then reveals that he is Luke's father.



Carrion-eating creatures that feast on the corpses of belboas.



Vat gas-filled creatures, which can reach up to ten kilometers long, obtain nutrients from the atmosphere using their long tentacles.

Luke Skywalker's severed hand and lightsaber fall down the central shaft and are thought lost. Later, however, the lightsaber is recovered.





Jedi Master Te Ansh is murdered on Utapau by Separatist plotters. The Jedi Council send Anakin Skywalker and Obi-Wan Kenobi to investigate.

UTAPAU

The windswept planet of Utapau is distinctive for its strange terrain, pockmarked with giant sinkholes into which the oceans drain, and its underground cities built from millions of animal bones. It is home to two native species, the Pau'ans and the Utai, as well as more recent arrivals the Amani.

DOXTILLION

Doxtillions are giant birdlike creatures that can be used as flying mounts.

TARACTY

General Grievous is destroyed by Obi-Wan Kenobi, who tears open his armor and kills him.

Kenobi's troops fire on him and his viceroy mount as Order 66 is issued, but the Jedi Master escapes.



Obi-Wan Kenobi duels General Grievous, but the Kaleesh cyborg escapes and the Jedi chase him.

Revenge arrives on Utapau, the Amani people live in villages on the windswept plains.

Sagi arms dealers meet with Separatist agents on Utapau to sell a giant kyber crystal. Master Te Ansh is murdered when she discovers the plot.

The Utai people do much of the manual labor on Utapau, under the direction of their fellow natives, the Pau'ans.

General Grievous attempts to escape Obi-Wan Kenobi on his impressive TSMEU-6 wheel bike.

The Pau'an people live in vast sinkhole cities beneath the planet's surface.



While investigating Master Te Ansh's death, Anakin Skywalker discovers Separatist MagnaGuards on the planet.



Jambda aly used by the Amani people to carry heavy loads. They are strong but slow.

Anakin Skywalker fails a Separatist plot to obtain a giant kyber crystal, which can be used to create powerful weapons, destroying it instead.

The rare mountains that live in Utapau's lakes can grow up to eight meters long.

Utapau's lakes and rivers drain into the sinkholes, where many strange creatures live.

MUSTAFAR

Once described as "where Jedi go to die," the searing lava world Mustafar is a planet of evil. Vast refineries extract precious minerals from the volcanic core of the planet, but it is better known for its history of violence, treachery, and death.



LAVA KELL



19 800: Obi-Wan Kenobi and Darth Vader duel amid the lava flows. Vader is defeated, and his body mangled and burned.



19 800: Overcome with rage and jealousy, Darth Vader turns on his wife, Padmé Amidala, and accuses her of betraying him.



1 800: Krogg the Dinabomber is employed to keep the delicate mine tunnels free of sandbunks and lava flows.



21 800: Anakin Skywalker and Ahsoka Tano rescue Force-sensitive children from Darth Sidious's secret facility.

4 900: In a Star Destroyer orbiting Mustafar, the Grand Inquisitor is defeated in a duel by the Jedi Kanan Jarrus. Rather than suffer the wrath of Darth Vader, the Inquisitor allows himself to fall to his death.



4 900: The Lethal who rescue their comrade Kanan Jarrus from Grand Moff Tarkin's flagship, the Sovereign, which is destroyed in the process.



19 900: Anakin Skywalker, now Darth Vader, slaughters the Separatist leaders at the order of his new master, Darth Sidious. This effectively ends the Clone Wars.



Sandbunks are insectoid predators native to Mustafar. They hunt in packs and are well protected by armor.



Lava flows drip across the fiery surface of Mustafar. They are large enough to be used as weapons by the native Mustafarians.



19 900: Mustafar was once home to the Black Sun crime syndicate. Its leader Xerxes Groussit, a Falleen, was killed when Darth Maul took over the organization.
